# **ANZAC Centenary**

ANZAC Day, originally a commemoration of the landing of Australian and New Zealand forces at Gallipoli on 25 April 1915, has grown to become one of the most important national days in Australia.

During the ANZAC Centenary we remember not only the original ANZAC's who served at Gallipoli and the Western Front, but commemorate more than a century of service by Australian servicemen and women.

The ANZAC Centenary will remember all wars, conflicts and peacekeeping operations in which Australia has been involved.

The Camden RSL Sub-Branch and Camden Council have been working together to develop a program of events to commemorate this milestone. These events will allow the community to show their support and appreciation to all those involved in war.

Each year Camden commemorates the ANZAC's with a number of ANZAC Day services.

On Friday 24 April a flagpole service will be held at Carrington Retirement Village, Werombi Road, Grasmere, commencing at 10.30am.

On Saturday 25 April the Dawn Service will commence at 5.20am at the Camden RSL Memorial site, within the Camden Bicentennial Equestrian Park, Cawdor Road, Camden. All guests and members of the community are requested to arrive and be seated by 5.15am.

The ANZAC Day March will commence at 10.30am moving along Argyle Street and down Cawdor Road and finishing at the Camden Bicentennial Equestrian Park.

The March will be followed by the Main Service at the Camden RSL Memorial site, commencing at 11am. Guests and members of the community are asked to arrive no later than 10.50am. All community groups and schools are invited to attend and participate in the ANZAC March. Register your interest with Camden RSL Sub-Branch on 0419 925 295 or via email beauley@bigpond.net.au

### Camden Town Centre Enhancement

Works will soon commence to revitalise the much-loved main street of Camden.

# Why are enhancements to the main street taking place?

- · to make footpaths more level
- to widen footpaths either side of Argyle Street by 1 metre - this will improve pedestrian access and allow more opportunity for outdoor dining
- to improve traffic management and encourage a slower speed environment
- · to improve pedestrian safety
- to cater for future growth as part of the South West Growth Centre

# What works are included in the enhancements?

- traffic lights at the intersection of Argyle and Oxley Streets
- pedestrian lights on Argyle Street between John and Hill Streets
- · a decked car park in Oxley Street
- new footpath paving and an upgrade to street furniture and lighting
- footpath widening of 1 metre either side of Argyle Street

### When are the works scheduled?

 The works in Argyle Street (Stage 1) are expected to take place over two stages to limit the impact as much as possible. Weather permitting, it is expected that the first stage of works between John and Oxley Streets will take place from July to November 2015

- Construction of the second stage of works between John and Hill Streets is expected to take place between January and June 2016
- The decked car park in Oxley Street is expected to be constructed in the 2016/2017 financial year

### Will the median strip remain?

 Yes. The median strip along Argyle Street will remain as is, except at Oxley Street to allow vehicles to turn right out of Oxley Street

### Will the Jacaranda trees be removed?

- approximately four of the 36 trees will be removed, two of which were planted in 2010
- every effort will be made to ensure any trees removed are relocated to new locations within the precinct

# What will happen to the traffic lanes in Argyle Street?

- the current configuration of two travel lanes in each direction will be maintained, along with one parking lane on both sides of Argyle Street
- the lanes adjacent to the median strip are remaining at their existing width of 3.2m which is well above the Roads and Maritime Services (RMS) standard of 2.8m for through lanes
- the kerbside lanes are being reduced to 3.2m to cater for the widened footpaths. This is well above the RMS standards of 2.9m for kerbside lanes

Did you know NSW households throw out \$1,000 worth of food each year?


Launched recently at the Camden Show, this fun children's story contains useful facts and tips for parents and carers on how to address food waste at home.

# **New Council Administration Building**

As the community continues to grow, the capacity to deliver Council's quality services must grow with it.

Council is committed to delivering quality services to the community.

Council offices at Narellan and Camden are nearing capacity and currently operate as two administration buildings which are 5km apart. In 2012, Council resolved to relocate to Oran Park to be located closer to the centre of the future Camden population.

The new building at Oran Park, approved by the Joint Regional Planning Panel in late 2014, will allow for a growing Council and ensure Council continues to deliver quality services to the community through a centralised administration centre.

Roads to the new civic precinct site are now being constructed and the access road to the site is expected to be finished in April.

The contemporary building will include staff office accommodation, an open plan customer service centre, multipurpose rooms for Council meetings and events, meeting rooms and public amenities.

Council have invited tenders for construction which is expected to commence in May 2015.



# Elderslie Trunk Drainage

Council is currently undertaking major works to the Elderslie trunk drainage system located adjacent to Lodges Road.

These works involve creation of important stormwater and water quality management systems required within the Oxley and Herbert Rivulets that run through the Elderslie developments.

These works include:

- Bulk earthworks
- Installation of detention and water quality treatment basins
- Installation of approximately 300m of footpaths
- Pedestrian bridge
- Landscaping

The works are on target to be completed by April 2015.



# Harrington Park Footbridge

Repairs to the Harrington Park footbridge have been completed.

The Harrington Park footbridge, which allows pedestrians to cross Narellan Creek between Harrington Park Public School, Fairfax Reserve and Fairwater Drive has been repaired.

Repairs of the bridge were needed due to termite damage to the timber parts of the bridge.

This work was completed at a cost of \$61,150 which is well under the approved budget of \$125,000.

Savings were achieved through reusing the existing larger structural steel elements and some of the existing footings that were undamaged.

Recycled non-slip plastic material was used for the decking and the creek underneath the footbridge was cleared of dead tree branches during the works to help with the water flow.

### Covered Outdoor Weather Area at Camden Town Farm

A Covered Outdoor Weather Area (COWA) has recently been constructed at Camden Town Farm, Exeter Street, Camden.

The Camden Town Farm Committee were successful in securing a grant under the NSW Government's Community Building Partnership Scheme to construct a COWA on the Camden Town Farm site.

In addition to this grant funding of \$20,000, Council and the Camden Town Farm Committee both contributed \$24,000 each towards the project.

The COWA will provide shelter for visiting school and educational groups as well as a popular venue for functions and celebrations.

## New Sports Hub at Narellan



Narellan Sports Hub is an exciting new Council project and will be located adjacent to the existing sporting facilities at Narellan Park.

This staged development is proposed to include the following:

- a 44 court netball complex
- · athletics facilities and sports grounds
- approximately 1,000 car spaces
- a centrally located amenities building (number 1 on the image above)

A walking/cycling network and playground are also being considered as part of the Sports Hub.

### Why a new Sports Hub?

Council's Sportsground Strategy 2014 identified the need for additional netball courts and sports grounds to cater for growth within the Camden area.

The endorsement of the Narellan Sports Hub Draft Masterplan supports the Sportsground Strategy and will allow for the expansion of sport in Camden.

### What is the next stage of the project?

Council is currently undertaking a Traffic Assessment Study of the proposed location and adjoining streets. The next phase of the project will be the development of the proposed scope of works and preliminary design for the first stage.

# Support for Special Achievers Program

Did you know that Camden Council provides financial assistance for residents who are selected to represent Camden at either a State or National level in cultural, academic or sporting events?

One-off grants of up to \$500 are provided through the Support for Special Achievers Program.

### **Eligibility**

- The cultural, academic or sport activity is to be of amateur status and generally promoted by a non-profit organisation
- A special achiever for the purposes of this program, is one who has been selected on merit, to represent NSW or Australia in their chosen field of endeavour. This includes people with disabilities
- Evidence of selection involving a merit based process must be provided
- No more than one donation will be granted to any applicant under this program
- The recipient shall be a resident of the Camden Local Government Area

### **Our Early Colonial Roads**

Many residents would be surprised to know how old the early roads of the Macarthur region really are.

Most early roads south-west of Sydney were established in the 1830's and, while have been widened, still exist today. These were initially formed in colonial times as tracks to provide access to land grants and as travel routes between early settlements.

Cowpasture Road was the first road of the Camden area, built in 1805 to provide access south-west of the colony from Prospect to the Cowpastures. The 'Cow Pastures' was the name given to the Camden area by Governor Hunter in 1803.


By 1814 a road from Liverpool joined Cowpasture Road at Leppington and became known as the Great South Road (now Camden Valley Way).

In 1826-1827, a timber bridge (Cowpasture Bridge) was built to enable the Great South Road to cross the Nepean River near the site of Camden Township. The road was extended to the township of Cawdor and over the Razorback Range in 1832. It provided the main route from Sydney to southern NSW and Melbourne.

Bringelly Road became known as the Northern Road providing access to Penrith and the Blue Mountains.

As a reminder of the age of these roads, milestones, Colonial homesteads and taverns still exist along these roads.


1976 - Cowpasture Bridge at time of official opening after repairs.

# Mount Annan Leisure Centre Expansion

To meet growing community demands, the Mount Annan Leisure Centre (MALC) facility will be expanded to include a range of new facilities.

The proposed scope of works for the expansion will include:

# Hot Tips for the Coming Winter

If you own a wood heater you can help improve our winter air quality by making sure that you use it correctly.

Check the flue, chimney and baffle regularly for a build-up of soot or creosote (a tar-like oily deposit). This build up can cause chimney fires if unchecked.

Only use aged dried hardwood in your fire. Freshly cut or unseasoned wood needs to be aged for eight to twelve months.

To find out how much moisture your wood contains borrow a moisture meter from Camden or Narellan Library.

Camden Art Prize


The 40th Annual Camden Art Prize is held annually to promote visual arts and to broaden and stimulate community perception of art, with a particular reference to Australian works.


