MAJOR PROJECTS



WATER PLAY PARKS **PROJECT UPDATE**

Council will proceed with the development of a new water play park in Elderslie after it adopted the design and construction tender at its Council meeting on 13 March 2018.

The \$2.4 million project will include water play equipment across three splash pads that will cater to all ages and incorporates new amenities and car parking facilities at Curry Reserve.

- The Curry Reserve Water Play Park project includes:
 Three splash pads, at a total size of 410m2;
 36 play features including toddlers 'discovery stream';
 Water heating, pump and filtration systems;
 Waterproof wheelchair and storage;

- Shade sails;
- Landscaping;
- Wheelchair accessible change facilities, including an adult hoist;
- New toilets, showers and change rooms; and
- Additional car parking.

Works are scheduled to begin in June and the water park is expected to be completed during summer.

YOUTH SPACES PROJECT UPDATE: DESIGNS FOR PLAY SPACES NOW COMPLETE

Plans for two new recreation play spaces in Harrington Park and Currans Hill are now complete.

The designs for the parks have been inspired by input gathered during community consultation in May 2017.

Council has allocated \$2 million for the design and construction of two youth play spaces, with both parks designed to incorporate the natural landscape of each site, creating unique, attractive and interactive recreation facilities.

Plans for Harrington Park Lake Reserve, Harrington Park include:

- Skate elements;
- Challenging climbing and Ninja Warrior style equipment;
- Accessible elements;

- A multi-use path for skaters, scooters and bicycles; and
- The existing carpark will be moved to the entry of he site, (off Fairwater Drive) and picnic facilities and landscaping installed; and
- unisex accessible toilet.

Plans for Sedgewick Reserve, Currans Hill include:

- The existing playground will be incorporated into the design;
- A sensory path and equipment to enhance diversity of play experiences;
- Areas for skating, scooters and bicycles; Large play structures like trampolines
- and climbing apparatus; A carpark drop-off with disabled
- parking, family parking and mini bus bay built near the entry point;
 - unisex accessible toilet; and Shade Sails.



ORAN PARK LIBRARY PROJECT UPDATE

Construction of the new Oran Park Library and Community Resource Centre is nearing completion, with the library planned to open for community use in mid-2018.

The two-storey library will provide a place of community development and information, education and recreation and will feature five activity rooms, children's reading nooks, open spaces, high ceilings and picturesque views across the Town Park.

Externally there will be an outdoor landscaped area which can be used for library activities and a civic plaza in front of the building for outdoor public events.

There is a focus on sustainable features to minimise the building's eco footprint including air conditioning linked to the Council administration building to reduce running costs and increase water use efficiency.

WORKS BEGIN ON ARGYLE STREET STAGE 3

Stage 3 improvement works to Argyle Street in Camden have commenced.

The focus of the \$2.3 million upgrade project will be between Oxley Street and Murray Street, with works complementing the look of the heritage buildings and the diversity of architecture along the street front. These works include:

- Widening and reconstruction of footpaths to improve footpath levels;
- Installation of new street furniture;
- Landscaping of the Murray Street roundabout;
- Additional trees (including a Jacaranda) and garden beds;
- · Installation of new street lighting; and,

• Improved drainage. Works are due for completion in late 2018.

ALAN BAKER ART GALLERY OFFICIALLY OPENED

In February 2018, the Mayor of Camden, Cr Lara Symkowiak officially opened Camden's first permanent public art gallery - The Alan Baker Art Gallery.

The gallery occupies the recently renovated, historic Macaria building (Council's former office building) and provides an opportunity to honour local artist Alan Baker and showcase his artworks.

The Alan Baker collection tells a story of life, Australian tradition, culture and artistic journey. His works reveal stories of love, family, community, war, beauty, darkness and tragedy; each capturing history. He reveals the people and places of Macarthur and the role he played in developing an arts network in Camden.

Whilst the gallery is a dedicated showcase of Alan Baker's works, it also provides an opportunity to connect local artists, foster future artists and promote art in Camden.

A total of 79 art works will be on exhibition for public viewing 11am – 4pm each Thursday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday at 37 John Street, Camden.

OFF-LEASH DOG PARKS

If you'd like to change up your regular walking routine with your pet, visit one of six Council owned and operated off-leash dog parks located at:

When you're taking your dog for a walk, your pet MUST be on a lead for the safety of everyone in our community.

MICROCHIPPING & REGISTRATION

Council is offering FREE microchipping for dogs and cats to all Camden residents.

All cats and dogs are required to be microchipped and registered with their local council.

Microchipping will be done from the comfort of your home by a qualified ranger.

Ensuring your pet is microchipped and details are up to date will assist rangers returning your beloved pet should it ever go missing or is stolen.

If you find a lost or stray animal, you have a number of options.

- Contact your local vet.
- Take the animal to Camden Animal Care Facility, located at the rear of Rossmore Veterinary Hospital, 651 Bringelly Road, Rossmore, Monday to Friday 9am – 5pm, Saturday/Sunday 9am – 4pm, closed public holidays.
- If possible, secure the animal in your yard and contact Council on the next business day.
