COUNCIL STANDS AGAINST BULLYING

Council has launched an anti-bullying campaign with new signage on three of its waste collection trucks designed by young people, to combat bullying.

Bullying was this year recognised as the number one issue affecting young people in the Camden community. Messages on the new trucks include "Bullying is Garbage", "Stand Up and Speak Out!" and includes contact details for both Lifeline and Kids Helpline.

MAJOR PROJECTS



MASTERPLAN ADOPTED FOR KIRKHAM PARK SPORTS COMPLEX

Plans for the future use of the multi-sport and recreational facility at Kirkham Park in Elderslie have now been secured.

Masterplan that outlines the future for the site and Stage One has been funded to a total of \$2.85 million, which will include a BMX expansion, additional rugby league fields and upgrade and improvements to the skatepark and playground. Council will be exploring further funding and grant opportunities.

The complete master plan includes:

- A new BMX track and jump park facilities:
- Cricket facilities:
- Rugby league grandstand with amenities and change room;
- Two new sports field areas;
- New car park area;
- Playground improvements;
- Cycle paths and connecting footpaths from surrounding areas;
- Relocation of fences: and
- Improved drainage systems.

CAMDEN TOWN CENTRE STREETSCAPE IMPROVEMENTS

The revitalisation of Argyle Street is continuing with Stage 4 works now in operation.

The \$2.2 million streetscape works between Hill Street and Elizabeth Street will include:

- Widening and construction of new footpaths;
- Installation of new street furniture;
- Additional trees and garden beds;
- Installation of new street lighting;
- Improved drainage; and
- Undergrounding of some overhead power lines.

Works are expected to be completed in June 2019, weather permitting.

Stage 3 of the works between Oxley Street and Murry Street were recently completed and continued the design theme already completed between Oxley Street and Hill Street and Elizabeth Street and Edward Street.

The revitalisation works will help ensure the main street of Camden remains relevant to our growing Local Government Area, while improving the safety and visual appeal of the historic town centre.

COUNCIL AWARDS TENDER TO UPGRADE NARELLAN INTERSECTION

A key intersection in Narellan will be upgraded as part of a \$3.57 million road project by the NSW Government.

The Camden Valley Way – Grahams Hill Road/Richardson Road intersection will be widened to straighten the lanes from Richardson Road to Grahams Hills Road and a right turn lane added to allow motorists to turn right onto Camden Valley Way.

Powerlines will be moved underground, new lights will be installed and roadside landscaping will also be completed as part of the project.

The new youth play space will expand on the existing young children's playground and will feature new playground equipment including a recessed trampoline, climbing equipment, musical equipment and natural play elements to enhance the diversity of play experiences.



Camden Council's first Water Play Space at Curry Reserve will be officially opened on Saturday 1 December from 10am to 3pm.

Bring the family and enjoy the new Water Play Space as well as water slides, face painting, jumping castles, sand sculpture workshops, barbeque lunch, ice cream and snow cones.

The fully accessible water play space has been designed for all ages and features heated water to improve comfort and allow extended access into the spring and autumn seasons.

Additional car parking and landscaping are also part of the project. New amenities will be delivered in autumn 2019.

On Saturday 3 November, the new Harrington Park Lake Reserve Youth Play Space was officially opened by the Mayor of Camden, Councillor Peter Sidgreaves.

Families enjoyed exploring the new Youth Play Space as well as jumping castles, free face painting and garden games.

The Space features challenging ninja warrior style equipment and amenities offering a dynamic play experience for all ages with a focus on 12 to 17 year old's.

Council committed almost \$5 million to deliver the outdoor play spaces at Harrington Park, Currans Hill and Elderslie to provide more options for children, young people and families to exercise and socialise.

Thousands of people gathered at Camden's annual Camden Festival from 8-23 September.

COUNCIL TACKLES ILLEGAL WASTE DUMPING

Illegal waste dumping in the Camden Council area is being targeted as part of a campaign to tackle this growing environmental and public health issue.

Since February this year, Council has investigated approximately 600 illegal waste dumping incidents on both public and private lands.

Willful or negligent disposal of waste may attract the following maximum penalties:

- for an individual: \$1 million and/ or 7-year prison sentence for willful offence and \$500,000 and/or 4-year prison sentence for negligent offences
- for a corporation: \$5 million for willful offences and \$2 million for negligent offences
- Council officers may also issue on-the-spot fines of up to \$4,000 for an individual and \$8,000 for corporations.

HOME SWIMMING POOL SAFETY

The home swimming pool environment is often a place of fun and enjoyment, however, home pools pose a high risk of drowning, particularly for children under five years of age.

If your pool is capable of being filled with 300mm of water, it must be surrounded by appropriate fencing (see the checklist).

Some common mistakes of home pools include;

- Pool gates not self-closing or left open intentionally;
- Pool enclosures including property fencing not maintained. This includes missing fence palings which provide children access to the swimming pool area;
- Items such as pot plants, BBQ's or toys placed at close proximity to pool fencing that can be used as climbing objects into the pool area; and
- Absence of resuscitation charts within the pool area.

FREE ACCESSIBILITY MASTER KEY TO ELIGIBLE CAMDEN RESIDENTS

To encourage and improve access and inclusion for people living with disability, Council is offering Master Locksmith Access Keys (MLAK) to eligible Camden residents. Key holders will have 24/7 access to designated accessible public toilets.

If you're a permanent resident within the Camden Local Government Area and hold a Disability Parking Permit, or written authority from a doctor confirming your health status, you can apply for a MLAK key free of charge.
