FUNDING FOR COMMUNITY GROUPS

Forty-seven local groups have received more than \$130,000 in funding, thanks to three components of our Community Financial Assistance Program.

The first component is the Cultural Performance Subsidy Program. Twelve local groups will receive more than \$13,000 in funding to help them access Camden Civic Centre to showcase performances and provide quality affordable entertainment to the community.

The second component is the Community Sponsorship Program, which aims to provide encouragement and support to community organisations by supplementing funds raised for their events and activities. Council approved 12 applications, requesting both in-kind and monetary support, to a total value of \$46,160.

The third and final component is the Community Small Grants Program, which aims to help build community capacity and engagement and, in turn, create an enriched and connected community. Twenty-three applications were supported for part and full funding, to the value of \$85,299.

MONOPOLY SOLD OUT

All 2,000 copies of the Camden Monopoly sold out in less than a week raising \$120,000, divided between Lifeline Macarthur and the Camden Wollondilly Domestic Violence Committee.

The Camden Monopoly features 22 locations from across the Camden area, selected by the community through a survey conducted last year. They included:

- St John's Anglican Church;
- · Birriwa Reserve Outdoor Youth Space;
- Belgenny Farm;
- · Camden Town Farm; and
- · Cobbitty Village.

CORRECTLY FITTED CHILD SEATS SAVE LIVES

We run four free Child Restraint Fitting and Checking Day per year, where you can have the child car restraints, harnesses and booster seats checked for safety and correct fit.

The next event will be held on Thursday 19 March. Bookings are essential and open to Camden LGA residents only. To book, call Council on 4654 7777.

Drivers with children, who are not safely fastened in the correct child car seat, may face a \$337 fine and loss of three demerit points.

FUN FACT

More than 160 local residents had child seats checked or fitted by Council in 2019.



MAJOR PROJECTS



NEW PLAYING FIELDS AT \$3.5 MILLION FOR ROAD KIRKHAM PARK

It's time for our footy players to lace up their boots because the two new rugby league fields at Kirkham Park, Elderslie, are now complete.

We've constructed an international-size field and a modified league size field, for junior competition and training.

The project also included:

- Significant bulk earthworks;
- Floodlighting of both fields to 100 lux training-standard;
- Irrigation and field drainage; and
- Turfing, retaining walls, fencing and landscaping.

The playing fields are part of the \$3.1 million first stage of Council's Kirkham Park Masterplan, which also includes the first stage of a new BMX track.

The track will cater for Club. State and National BMX events. It includes the construction of:

- A five-metre start hill;
- Access ramps;
- A main racetrack;
- Floodlighting;
- Timing and scoring system; and
- Landscaping.

UPGRADES

We've accepted more than \$3.5 million in grant funding to upgrade and design road improvements throughout the Camden area.

The funding, granted under the Western Sydney Infrastructure Plan's Local Roads Package, will be used for:

- The Porrende Street upgrade, which involves demolition and reconstruction of the existing roundabout, modifications to the approach roads adjacent to Bunnings and Narellan Sports Hub entries and utility relocations. The works will be coordinated with the Narellan Sports Hub Stage Two works and the seasonal users of the existing facilities at the Sports Hub; and
- Remembrance Driveway/Old Hume Highway Corridor upgrade, which involves developing a route strategy and concept designs for the future upgrade of intersections in Remembrance Driveway in Camden South, primarily at Elizabeth Macarthur Avenue and Armour Avenue.



MAJOR PROJECTS

NEW PARK COMING TO COBBITTY

A new park is making its way to the Arcadian Hills estate, between Olive Hill Drive and The Northern Road.

The site includes the original gravel access road to the historic Denbigh House and, as such, the park will pay homage to the heritage development in and around the Denbigh Estate.

The new park will include:

- A passive recreation space:
- New paths;
- New park furniture;
- Garden areas;
- Trees;
- New turf;
- Timber steppers; and
- The refurbishment of the original entry gates.

Construction is due to be complete in mid-2020, weather permitting.

We've also recently renewed five playgrounds across the Camden area, designed for young residents from four to 12 years. They include:

- · Harrington Park Reserve, Swan Circuit, Harrington Park;
- Solander Reserve, Mount Annan;
- Manna Gum Reserve, Yate Place, Mount Annan;
- · Little Reserve, Camden; and
- Eastlewood Reserve, Narellan.

CAMDEN'S NEW LSPS IS ONE STEP CLOSER

We're one step closer to finalising the area's new Local Strategic Planning Statement (LSPS). The draft LSPS has been sent to the Greater Sydney Commission for assurance.

Subject to this formal assurance, a further report will be presented to Councillors in the coming months, to adopt the final LSPS.

The LSPS is important because it sets the 20-year vision for land use in the local area, the special character and values that are to be preserved and how change will be managed into the future.



SPRING INTO NEW COMMUNITY FACILITY

Spring Farm residents now have a brand-new community facility to enjoy.

The \$3 million, 500 square metre multipurpose centre is located on Richardson Road, Spring Farm and it features:

- · An activity hall;
- · Meeting room;
- Foyer;
- · Kitchen:
- · Amenities; and
- A carpark with 26 spaces and associated landscaping. Spring Farm is home to more than 5,000 residents and this new facility will provide these residents, as well as the entire Camden community, a beautiful space to enjoy.

1,000 EXTRA CAR SPACES AT LEPPINGTON STATION

Work on 1,000 additional commuter car parking spaces at Leppington Station is due to start in mid-2020 and finish mid-2021, thanks to the NSW Government's revised plans.

The 2016 census told us more than 26,000 residents, or 65.6 per cent of our area's resident workers, travel outside Camden to work. Almost 3,000 of these workers commute by train, so the extra spaces for these commuters are much needed.

CAMDEN'S CREATIVES TAKE THE LEAD

The Camden Youth Empowerment Project is returning this year, after \$50,000 in funding was successfully secured.

The project, entitled Camden's Creatives Take The Lead, will provide young people, aged between 12 and 25 years, the opportunity to develop key skills for employment through the management of four youth-led events throughout the Camden area.

A Project Leadership Team will be formed from existing young leaders from Camden Council's Youth Council and young people eager to have experience in event management. These events will allow full involvement in all facets of event management and delivery, helping local youth develop key skills needed to obtain employment. These include:

- Marketing;
- Stage management;
- · Audio production;
- Live performance;
- Curation of art displays;
- Young people consultation; and
- Provision of information on health and education services available to young people.

FLOATING WETLANDS FOR HARRINGTON PARK

Council has been successful in receiving grant funding from the Australian Government to install floating wetlands within Harrington Park Wetland under the Communities Environment Program.

Harrington Park Lake is an important local waterway, however its location in a developed catchment means that it receives high nutrient and pollutant loads in stormwater runoff. The installed wetlands will help to improve water quality by biologically treating the water and removing pollutants, including sediment, nutrients and heavy metals while also providing aeration of the water.
