Community feedback considered in planning for new water play parks and play spaces

Community feedback about two water play parks and two recreation play spaces proposed for the Camden area is being used to help design the leisure facilities.

A total of 237 responses were received during the community consultation campaign held in May about the water play parks planned for Elderslie and Oran Park and two recreation play spaces at Harrington Park and Currans Hill.

"The information and ideas put forward by residents will be used to guide the initial concept design of these new facilities," said Mayor Lara Symkowiak.

"Understanding the needs of the community will help Council to provide facilities that are the most appealing and appropriate for residents," Cr Symkowiak said.

"These new facilities will become an attraction to the area and offer a place for people to socialise and have fun," she said.

In April, Council resolved to allocate \$4 million for the design and construction of the parks, including a funding component of the water park in Oran Park that will developed as part of a voluntary planning agreement with Greenfield Development Corporation and Urban Growth.

The survey responses identified that there was strong support for a variety of challenging play equipment in colours inspired by nature for the recreation play spaces.

The concept designs are scheduled to be completed and presented to the community later this year.
