Young people can cool off for free

Teenagers living in the Camden area are eligible for free entry to two public swimming pools during the month of January in the school holidays.

The Cool Off in Camden program is a trial being run by Council's Youth Services to encourage outdoor activity for residents aged between 12 and 18 years or in school years 7 - 12.

"This initiative offers young people an active option during their extended summer holiday break," said Mayor Lara Symkowiak.

"Our swimming pools are an excellent place for people to socialise, exercise and escape the heat when needed," Cr Symkowiak said.

The access card provides free entry for up to eight visits to Camden War Memorial Pool and Mount Annan Leisure Centre between 1-29 January.

Places are limited and the access card can be collected by a parent of the young person or the young person themselves from Camden and Narellan Libraries, the Council administration building in Oran Park or at either of the swimming pools.

It is recommended that card holders arrive early at each pool to avoid disappointment. There is a limit of 30 free places per day at each pool.
