Learner Log Book Run through Macarthur

Learner drivers can gain valuable hours driving on a variety of road conditions as part of the Learner Log Book Run.

Camden and Campbelltown councils are providing the free driving course in collaboration with local Highway Patrol police to prepare learner drivers for real motorist experiences.

"This course will highlight the importance of driving with caution, following the road rules and acting responsibly when using the road," said Mayor Lara Symkowiak.

"The lessons taken from this log book run could stay with them for their driving careers and potentially save their lives," Cr Symkowiak said.

"It assists our learner drivers to attain the hours required under the graduated licensing scheme," she said.

A driving instructor will attend on the day to provide information and guidance to learners and their supervisors.

The course includes 2.5 hours of driving and takes in various road types including suburban streets, rural roads, multi lane roads and freeway driving in the Macarthur region.

It will start at Narellan Library at 9am and finish at 2pm, Sunday 18 March. Morning tea and lunch are provided. The free course is open to any learner driver with more than 25 log book hours.
