Solving pet problems at Paws in the Park

From scaredy cats and aggression to barking and anxiety, pet problems will be solved when animal behaviourist Dr Jo Righetti comes to Camden next month.

Dr Righetti will make an appearance at the Paws in the Park event on Sunday, 6 May, and field questions from residents on all things dog or cat related, big or small.

An expert on animal behaviour, Dr Righetti has 20 years of experience in solving pet problems, and is the author of a series of books and the host of radio segment Talking Pets.

Mayor Lara Symkowiak said Dr Rhigetti had previously visited Camden to help residents curb bad barking habits, and would provide valuable advice at the Paws in the Park event.

"This event is all about the human connection to pets, so it makes sense to have someone on board who will be able to help improve that relationship for our residents," Cr Symkowiak said.

"I anticipate Dr Rhigetti will be inundated with questions from our passionate residents, and hopefully everyone goes away with an idea of how they can better live alongside their pet without issue."

Common subjects that Dr Rhigetti speaks on include: finding pet friendly housing; improving the animal bond; travelling with animals; house training; and how to help pets cope with being home alone.

She also covers behavioural problems such as barking; destructive behaviour; eating issues; toileting and scratching.
