## Young people can cool off for free

Cooling off in Camden has never been easier for local teenagers with free entry to Camden's two pools on offer in January next year.

Council's Cool Off in Camden program offers young residents aged between 12 and 18 the chance to swim for free at Camden War Memorial Pool and Mount Annan Leisure Centre.

Mayor, Cr Peter Sidgreaves said young people now have many opportunities to cool down during school holidays in the area.

"Cool Off in Camden is another program run by Council to help our local youngsters have a great time and keep cool during the school holidays," Cr Sidgreaves said.

"This is a great initiative to enjoy our great local swimming pools during the summer holiday break."

"Coupled with the recent opening of Curry Reserve Water Play Park, there are endless opportunities for young people to escape the heat."

Teenagers living in the Camden area can collect an access card that provides them entry for up to eight visits throughout January 2019.

Places are limited and access cards can be collected from Council's Administration building in Oran Park, Camden and Narellan Libraries, Camden War Memorial Pool or Mount Annan Leisure Centre from Monday 3 December.

To avoid disappointment, it is recommended for card holders to arrive early at each pool with a limit of 30 free places per day at each pool.
