Young people invited to create public art

Creative young people aged 12-25 years are invited to help make the designs for the area's next public art project.

Rotary Park in Camden South will be the focus of the fourth annual Youth Public Art Participation Project.

"This is an opportunity for young people to be involved in making public art and share their ideas about the area to be incorporated in the design," said Mayor Lara Symkowiak.

"The site is highly visible from a major thoroughfare in Camden and will really make an impression on the broader community," Cr Symkowiak said.

The mural will incorporate living plants to create a visually attractive, dynamic artwork on a (2.6m high x 4.5m wide) block wall in the park that is on the corner of Cowper Drive and Old Hume Highway, Camden South. The project also includes a services box on the site.

Professional and experienced artist Tim de Haan, also known as PHIBS, will work with a group of young people and develop visual concept designs from 10am to 1pm, Saturday 8 September.

The free workshop will include refreshments for all participants. To register attendance for the workshop young people must be aged 12 – 25 years and reside in the Camden LGA.
