Make your own flower crown at Alan Baker Art Gallery

Residents are invited to celebrate spring and its beautiful blooms in a creative way, at Camden Council's inaugural Flower Crown Workshop.

Chloe, Jordan and Shannon Gow from Camden-based florist, Flowerchild Arrangements, will run a flower crown making demonstration on **Saturday 21 September**, **10am**, **at Alan Baker Art Gallery**.

"We'll teach participants different wiring techniques, which flowers to select and how to attach them properly," Jordan Gow said.

"Participants can enjoy morning tea whilst they're learning. They can choose, cut and prepare a selection of flowers and foliage to make their own unique flower crown.

"We'll be working with lots of different flowers, including spray roses, paper daisies, round leaf gum and a few seasonal flowers.

"It's such a fun and relaxing way to spend a Saturday morning!"

It is \$30 to attend the workshop and all flowers and materials will be included.

Mayor of Camden, Cr Theresa Fedeli, said the workshop was part of the Spring Exhibition at the Art Gallery, which will be on display until Sunday 1 December.

"This exhibition continues to celebrate Baker and his stories of family, community, scenes and love," Cr Fedeli said.

"One of the three main features is 'Flora' which is just perfect for this time of year."
