Background

The Roads and Maritime Services (RMS) is legislated as the Authority responsible for the control of traffic on all NSW Roads. In order to deal with the large number and range of traffic related matters, RMS has delegated certain aspects of the control of traffic on local roads to Council (under the Transport Administration Act 1988). To exercise this delegation, Councils must establish a Local Traffic Committee (LTC) and obtain the advice of the RMS and NSW Police.

Role of the Committee

The LTC is primarily a technical review and advisory committee which considers the technical merits of proposals and ensures that current technical guidelines are considered. It provides recommendations to Council on traffic and parking control matters and the provision of traffic control facilities and prescribed traffic control devices for which Council has delegated authority. The Committee also advises on traffic matters arising from development applications (regulatory signage and line marking only), special events and road safety issues.

Committee Delegations

The LTC has no decision-making powers. Council must refer all traffic related matters to the Local Traffic Committee prior to exercising its delegated functions. Matters related to State Roads or functions that have not been delegated to Council must be referred directly to the RMS or relevant organisation.

The Committee provides recommendations to Council. Council is not bound by the advice of its LTC. Council can choose not to proceed with a recommendation of the Local Traffic Committee by not endorsing it at a Council Meeting where the minutes are presented.

Should Council wish to act contrary to the advice of the Committee or if that advice is not supported unanimously by the Committee members, Council must write to both the RMS and NSW Police, who may then choose to appeal to the Regional Traffic Committee within 14 days.

Committee Membership

The LTC is made up of four formal voting members. The members are as follows:

- one representative of Council as nominated by Council;
- one representative of the NSW Police from each Local Area Command (LAC) within the LGA;
- one representative from the RMS; and
- the local State Member(s) of Parliament (MP) or their nominee.

Where the Council area is represented by more than one MP or covered by more than one Police LAC, representatives are only permitted to vote on matters within their electorate or LAC.

The role of the four voting members is to:

- review the information provided to the committee.
- advise whether or not the technical justification of facilities meet the relevant guidelines and standards (facilities include lines, signs and devices).
- ensure that the recommendations conform to the matters being referred to and should be recommended for Council to endorse.

In relation to this:

- I. The council representatives and Local Members of Parliament (or representative) typically consider the interests of Council and its constituents. Both representatives on the Committee provide valued local knowledge.
- II. The Road and Maritime Services (RMS) representative provides advice on compliance of the matters with regards to various standards and guidelines.
- III. The NSW Police representative provides input on implications for the road network, particularly where a proposal may affect road safety.

The Committee may also have additional informal (non-voting) advisors. These may include:

- Council Officers
- Chamber of Commerce representatives
- Bus Operator representatives
- Other representatives as determined from time to time.

The informal advisors are not required to attend every LTC meeting. Their attendance is only necessary when items appear on the Agenda which affect their area of expertise or responsibility. The informal advisors are not entitled to a vote.

Please note there is no public gallery for these meetings.

LTC Business Paper

Council is responsible for preparing an LTC agenda and circulates to all formal members and informal advisors of the committee approximately one week prior to the meeting. This will allow members to fully consider the issues and determine their response on each item.

Council encourages each member of the LTC to undertake a site visit prior to considering any proposal. Site visits may be undertaken individually or organised with Council's Traffic Engineer(s).

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence for the installation of signage, line marking and devices associated with the upgrading and reconstruction of Richardson Road, Spring Farm.

BACKGROUND

The overall reconstruction of Richardson Road forms an integral part of the development of the Spring Farm Urban Release Area. Council is undertaking the upgrading of the road between Liz Kernohan Drive and Welling Drive as the final stage of the full urban upgrade of the existing rural type road, noting that part of this road alignment is outside of the Release Area (see **Attachment 1**). This report relates to the regulatory signs, lines and devices associated with the upgrade.

MAIN REPORT

Council is undertaking the upgrade of Richardson Road, Spring Farm, between Liz Kernohan Drive and Welling Drive, to its ultimate formation. This will see the road reconstructed from a rural Local Road to an urban Collector Road. The Richardson Road current speed limit is posted at 60km/hr speed limit which will remain in place when the road is reconstructed.

Camden Council Plan No. 2013-012 Sheet 13 (see **Attachment 2**) details the proposed signs, lines and devices for the project.

The plan indicates:

- edgelines and centrelines;
- a roundabout at the intersection at the Road No. 1 (Bluebell Crescent) under construction by others and previously approved by the Local Traffic Committee;
- a refuge island north of the intersection with Ingham Street with associated signs and lines;
- a refuge island south of the intersection with Welling Drive associated signs and lines; and
- Bus Zones on either side of the road between Ingham Street and Bluebell Crescent.

FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

The proposed line marking, signs and devices are to be installed as part of the allocated Richardson Road Reconstruction project budget in 2017/18 and 2018/19. It is envisaged that the long term maintenance of signage and lines would be funded through the Roads and Maritime Services Block Grant for traffic facilities.



CONCLUSION


The proposed signs, lines and traffic facilities for the section of Richardson Road being reconstructed are designed to support the safety of the road users. The design satisfies Council requirements and relevant standards. It is recommended that the Local Traffic Committee approves the signs, lines and traffic management devices detailed in this report.

RECOMMENDED



SUBJECT: MOUNT ANNAN DRIVE, MOUNT ANNAN - EDGELINE AND

CENTRELINE MARKING

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence for the installation of double centerline marking and edgeline marking along Mount Annan Drive, Mount Annan between Stenhouse Drive and the Botanic Gardens.

BACKGROUND

Concerns have been raised regarding motorists not keeping left and traveling at speed along Mount Annan Drive, Mount Annan.

MAIN REPORT

Mount Annan Drive is a collector Road. The section between Stenhouse Drive and Botanic Gardens measures 11m in width and permits parking on both sides of the road.

The curved nature of the section of Mount Annan Drive between the Botanic Gardens and Stenhouse Drive results in safety concerns associated when motorists do not keep to their side of the road.

Local Traffic Committee has previously supported implementing line marking along other sections of Mount Annan Drive in order to address speeding and delineation concerns.

Community consultation was undertaken and two responses were received. One was in support, while the other questioned the effectiveness of line marking and requested alternate measures such as speed cushions.

FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

It is proposed that the cost of installation be funded from the RMS Block Grant (Traffic Facilities Component) for the 2017/18 financial year at an approximate cost of \$1,000.

CONCLUSION

Concerns have been raised regarding delineation and speeding concerns along Mount Annan Drive and it is proposed to implement centerline and edgeline marking.


RECOMMENDED

The Local Traffic Committee recommends that Council approves in Mount Annan Drive, Mount Annan, double barrier (BB) centrelines and edgelines between Stenhouse Drive and the Australian Botanic Garden roundabout.

SUBJECT: JAMBOREE AVENUE, LEPPINGTON - CENTRELINE

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence for centreline marking on Jamboree Avenue, Leppington.

BACKGROUND

Community concerns have been raised regarding motorists speeding along Jamboree Avenue.

MAIN REPORT

Jamboree Avenue is an 11 metre wide collector road in the Willowdale precinct that runs between Denham Court Road and St Andrews Road. There is an S1 centreline along Jamboree Avenue northeast of Willowdale Drive (within Campbelltown LGA) and it has a default urban speed limit of 50km/h. The boundary between Camden and Campbelltown was adjusted after the subdivision was approved and is denoted by the brown line in **Attachment 1**.

To help address concerns and to be consistent with the north-eastern section, it is proposed to install broken (S1) centreline marking on Jamboree Avenue between Willowdale Drive and Tunnel Street (see **Attachment 2**) to provide safe and comfortable movement of motorists. The proposal will not impact on-street parking.

Public consultation was undertaken proposing the line marking and six responses were received in support of the proposal.

Some respondents suggest that traffic calming device likes speed humps to further reduce vehicular speed.

Council's comment

Speed humps can be effective in keeping vehicle speeds down. However their use in collector roads can increase traffic noise and vibration, may damage vehicles if traversed at too great a speed and slow down emergency vehicles. Research indicates that noise and vibration from heavy vehicles passing over speeds humps is significantly higher than cars. Installation of speed humps in Jamboree Avenue is therefore not considered appropriate at this time.

FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

It is proposed that the cost be funded from the RMS Block Grant (traffic facilities component) for the 2017/18 financial year.



CONCLUSION


Concerns have been raised about motorists speeding in Jamboree Avenue, and it is recommended that the Committee supports additional road markings to help address the issue.

RECOMMENDED

The Local Traffic Committee recommends that Council approves a broken separation line (S1) between on Jamboree Avenue between Willowdale Drive and Tunnel Street, Leppington.

SIGNAGE LINEMARKING AND KERB ALIGNMENTS

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence for the installation of signage, line marking and devices associated with the Camden Town Centre Enhancement works - Stage 3.

BACKGROUND

Council is undertaking the next stage of infrastructure improvements in Argyle Street, Camden. The purpose of this report is to seek concurrence from the Local Traffic Committee for the installation of signage, line marking and devices associated with these works.

MAIN REPORT

Signage, line marking and kerb alignments plans associated with the Camden Town Centre Enhancement Works Stage 3 have been prepared by Council in the location highlighted on **Attachment 1**.

The Engineering Drawing No. 2017-015, sheet 24 provides details of the proposed signage and line marking (**Attachment 2**). Consistent with previous stages, the plans incorporate:

- footpath widening on both sides with amended lane and parking widths, specifically:
 - 2.6 metre wide parking bays;
 - 3.3 metre wide kerbside lane;
 - 3.1 metre wide median lane;
- marked parking bays on Argyle Street; and
- provision of a pedestrian refuge with associated signage and linemarking on Cawdor Road, west of the intersection with Murray Street.

The plans are considered to comply with the requirements of Council and in accordance with relevant Standards subject to:

- All Traffic Left (R2-14L) sign being installed on the Argyle Street median opposite the Woolworths egress;
- ii. unidirectional hazard markers (D4-1-2) being installed on the roundabout intersection of Argyle Street, Murray Street and Cawdor Road; and
- iii. Motor Bike Only (R5-1-4) parking retained on the southern side of Argyle Street for 6.5 metres east of the intersection with Murray Street.

FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS



The installation of traffic signals, kerbs, signage and linemarking is being funded through by Council from the overall Camden Town Centre Enhancement project budget.

CONCLUSION

Council is undertaking infrastructure improvements in Argyle Street, Camden. The current stage of works incorporates a new refuge island, footpath widening on both sides with amended lane widths and minor amendments to parking restrictions to reflect new kerb extensions.

RECOMMENDED


The Local Traffic Committee recommends that Council approves the signs, linemarking and devices in Argyle Street, Camden, as shown on Plan No. 2017-015 sheet 24, associated with Camden Town Centre Enhancement Works Stage 3 subject to:

- i. All Traffic Left (R2-14L) sign being installed on the Argyle Street median opposite the Woolworths egress;
- ii. unidirectional hazard markers (D4-1-2) being installed on the roundabout intersection of Argyle Street, Murray Street and Cawdor Road; and
- iii. Motor Bike Only (R5-1-4) parking retained on the southern side of Argyle Street for 6.5 metres east of the intersection with Murray Street.

SUBJECT: TRAMWAY DRIVE, CURRANS HILL - PARKING RESTRICTIONS AT

CURRANS HILL PUBLIC SCHOOL

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence to change part of a Bus Zone restriction to a timed No Parking restriction and also to implement painted medians.

BACKGROUND

Council officers have observed parking stress in Tramway Drive, Currans Hill, during school pick up and drop off times. Council has been working closely with Currans Hill Public school in order to investigate measures to address the issue.

MAIN REPORT

Council officers have been made aware of parking issues particularly at school pick up and drop off times. The school frontage, north of the pedestrian crossing, currently has a 35m bus zone and approximately 25m of No Parking restrictions. The bus zone is generally has one bus at a time during pick up and drop off periods.

It is proposed that the Bus Zone is shortened to 18m which can accommodate one bus at any one time. It is also proposed that the remaining 17m be changed from a Bus Zone to a No Parking restriction (R5-40) 8am-9:30am; 2:30-4pm school days — Buses Excepted with Kiss and Ride Area sub-plate (R9-302). It is recommended that the buses are excepted from the No Parking restriction for the entire length of No Parking restrictions (60m) to accommodate charter buses to utilize parking during those times, if required.

It is also proposed to have painted hatching from the departure of the pedestrian crossing in the parking lanes to further reiterate the No Stopping restrictions and deter people from parking.

FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

It is proposed that the cost be funded from the RMS Block Grant (Traffic Facilities component) for the 2017/18 financial year.

CONCLUSION

Council officers have undertaken an investigation into arrangements at drop-off and pick-up times for Currans Hill Public school and it is recommended that parking restrictions along the school frontage, north of the pedestrian crossing, are amended and painted islands are implemented on the departures of the pedestrian crossing to help manage traffic.



RECOMMENDED

That the Local Traffic Committee recommends that Council approves in Tramway Drive, Currans Hill:

- i. 18 metres Bus Zone (R5-20)
- ii. 60 metres No Parking (R5-40) 8am 9:30am, 2:30pm-4pm, School Days, Buses Excepted with sub plate Kiss and Ride Area (R9-302)

SUBJECT: HOLDSWORTH DRIVE, NARELLAN VALE - NO STOPPING

RESTRICTIONS AT MELALEUCA ROAD INTERSECTION

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence for the installation of No Stopping restrictions on Holdsworth Drive, Narellan Vale, at the intersection with Melaleuca Road.

BACKGROUND

Concerns have been raised regarding motorists parking in Melaleuca Road at school times impacting on vehicles manoeuvring in the road and at the roundabout intersection with Holdsworth Drive.

MAIN REPORT

Holdsworth Drive is a collector road and parking is facilitated on both sides along most of its length by edgelines. The subject intersection is near to St Claire's Catholic Primary School and at school pick-up and drop-off times parking tends to occur too close to the roundabout for it to operate safely and effectively, and along Melaeuca Road.

There is existing hatched linemarking behind the edgelines in the vicinity of the roundabout to discourage parking. To give additional clarity it is being recommended that 22 metres of No Stopping (R5-400 signage) restrictions be implemented on the western side of Holdsworth Drive to supplement the line marking as detailed in **Attachment 1** and 18m of No Stopping (R5-400 signage) restrictions be implemented on the southern side of Melaleuca Road.

Residents were consulted about the above proposal, as well as an extended section of timed No Stopping signage along the southern section of Melaleuca Road between Holdsworth Drive and She Oak Grove. Three respondents did not support the additional section of timed parking (one in writing and two by telephone) and one respondent supported it. In view of the lack of support, this component is not proposed to be taken forward by Council. The full time restriction around the corner of the roundabout is strongly supported by the adjacent resident.

FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

It is proposed that the cost of installation be funded from the RMS Block Grant (Traffic Facilities component) for the 2017/18 financial year at an approximate cost of \$400.



CONCLUSION

Concerns have been raised about parking too close to a roundabout on Holdsworth Drive and it is recommended that the Committee supports parking restrictions to address this issue.


RECOMMENDED

- i. 22m of No Stopping (R5-400) restrictions along the western side of Holdsworth Drive; and
- ii. 18m of No Stopping (R5-400) restrictions on the southern side of Melaleuca Road.

MAIN REPORT

A signage and line marking plan has been received by Council for Catherine Park Stage 7 Subdivision by Hixson developers. This is related to DA number DA/2017/389/1. Banfield Drive intersects with Oran Park Drive opposite Harrington Parkway. The location is highlighted on **Attachment 1**.

The Engineering Drawing Project No. X12249.07 Drawing No. 711 Rev. 03 prepared by Calibre provides details of the proposed signage and line marking (**Attachment 2**). Banfield Drive itself was considered by the Local Traffic Committee in April 2017 as part of the adjacent Oran Park Tranche 31 and 32 subdivisions by Greenfields Development Company, which will be constructing the road. At that time, the Committee gave concurrence for Give Way controls opposite Road Nos. 15 and 20 in anticipation of the future four-way intersections with the road now being delivered as part of this subdivision.

The plan is considered to be in accordance with Austroads, Australian Standards and RMS supplements for the placement of regulatory signage and line marking and it is recommended that LTC supports the proposed measures.






The Engineering Drawing Project No. 16-000888CC Drawing No. 702 Rev. 1 prepared by Calibre provides details of the proposed signage and line marking (**Attachment 2**). The subdivision connects with Hinton Loop which has already been constructed through a separate subdivision. Give Way controls are proposed at a new 4-way intersection and a modified T-intersection. No Stopping restrictions are proposed due to the narrowness of the laneways. However the restrictions need to be terminated in Hinton Loop at the intersection of Road No. 1, shown by marked up red dots on the plan.

The plan is considered to be in accordance with Austroads, Australian Standards and RMS supplements for the placement of regulatory signage and line marking and it is recommended that LTC supports the proposed measures.

At the Camden LTC meeting of 17 October 2017 the following was resolved:

The Local Traffic Committee recommends that Council, in The Cascades, Mount Annan, during the 2017 season:

i. approves in the vicinity of The Rapids, subject to community consultation, temporary timed No Stopping restrictions 8 – 11pm;

Consultation has been completed and no objections have been received to this proposal. Council is therefore progressing with the temporary restrictions.

ii. undertakes community consultation on permanent parking restrictions at the intersection of The Cascades and The Watermark.

At the end of the consultation period, two responses had been received and neither from the immediate vicinity of the proposal. One response requested further restrictions be implemented by Council. The other raised concern about Council promoting the Christmas lights display completion. The measures discussed by the Local Traffic Committee are considered proportionate. In view of the lack of specific objections by directly affected residents it is recommended to proceed with the proposed permanent restrictions.



PURPOSE OF REPORT

To document concurrence previously provided by the Local Traffic Committee through an Electronic Meeting for the Australian Red Cross Blood Service to park their vehicle for visits in 2018.

MAIN REPORT

The Australian Red Cross Blood Service operates a mobile blood donor service using a large walk-in vehicle and trailer. As per previous years, the Blood Service is proposing to use seven 90 degree angle parking spaces on the south-west side of the Oxley/Mitchell Streets Car Park (adjacent to Woolworths) to set up the service (see **Attachment 1**). The dates proposed for the Donormobile visits in 2018 are:

- Visit 1: 22 January to 25 January 2018;
- Visit 2: 16 April to 20 April 2018;
- Visit 3: 9 July to 13 July 2018; and
- Visit 4: 2 October to 5 October 2018.
- Visit 5: 24 December to 28 December 2018

The vehicle has successfully operated in this location in the past. it is not considered that the proposal would have a significant impact on parking provision or traffic operations in the area. It is therefore recommended that concurrence is given to the application.


