SUBJECT: GLEDSWOOD HILLS DRIVE, GLEDSWOOD HILLS - EDGELINE MARKING AT WESTERN END

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence for the installation of edge line marking in Gledswood Hills Drive, Gledswood Hills, between The Hermitage Way and Amberly Street.

BACKGROUND

Concerns have been raised regarding motorists driving in a manner that compromises road user safety on Gledswood Hills Drive. Measures are proposed to help address these concerns.

MAIN REPORT

Gledswood Hills Drive is a collector road with residential frontages and is also situated along a bus route. It measures 11 metres in width along most of its length with kerb extensions at intersections. Edgelines have been installed along most of the length of the road by a developer except for a 200-metre-long section at the western end which was built by another developer. This was approved at an earlier date, before warrants could be demonstrated for edgelines. Traffic volumes in this location were recorded in November 2020 at a daily average of 5,392 vehicles.

As reported to the Committee in November 2020, concerns have been raised by the public about speeds and number of vehicles on Gledswood Hills Drive and consideration has being given to additional linemarking. Edgelines are proposed at the western end to provide travel lanes 3.3 metres wide with parking lanes 2.2 metres wide, for the remaining section of road without edgelines. The edgelines would not impact on on-street parking provision. Give Way signage and linemarking is also proposed at Amberly Street (see **Attachment 1**).

FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

It is proposed that the cost of installation be funded from the TfNSW Block Grant (Traffic Facilities Component) for the 2021/22 financial year at an approximate cost of \$2,000.

CONCLUSION

Concerns have been raised about vehicles speeding along Gledswood Hills Drive and it is recommended that the Committee supports edgelines to help address the issue.




RECOMMENDED

The Local Traffic Committee recommends that Council approves in Gledswood Hills Drive, Gledswood Hills:

- i. Edgelines (E4) between The Hermitage Way and Amberly Street; and
- ii. Give way signage and linemarking and 10 metres of double barrier (BB) lines at the intersection with Amberley Street.

SUBJECT: COBBITTY ROAD, COBBITTY - REFUGE ISLAND AND BUS BAYS AT MACARTHUR ANGLICAN SCHOOL

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence for the installation of a refuge island and bus bays and in Cobbitty Road at Macarthur Anglican School between the intersections with Governor Drive and Nectarine Crescent.

BACKGROUND

Council has successfully secured funding under the Transport for NSW Active Transport Program to install bus bays and a pedestrian crossing point in Cobbitty Road, Cobbitty. This report details the associated signage, linemarking and devices.

MAIN REPORT

The NSW Government is providing funding for the construction of a bus bay and refuge island crossing in Cobbitty Road, Spring Farm, through the Active Transport Program. This program supports measures to encourage walking and public transport access.

A detailed proposal is shown Plan No, 2019-043 (Sheet 9) in **Attachment 1**. This includes an indented bus bay on the either side of the road with associated Bus Zone signage. There are existing No Stopping restrictions along both kerb lines. The refuge island has a gap, 2 metres wide and 3.6 metres long. The islands incorporate Keep Left signs and the existing refuge island advanced warning sign will be relocated on the approach.

Adjacent owners and occupiers and Macarthur Anglican School were consulted on this proposal. No objections were received.

FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

The works are budgeted at \$212,000, funded by a grant from the NSW Active Transport Program and match funded by Council in the 2020/21 financial year, as approved by Council on 10 November 2020. This budget with also fund new footpath, kerb and gutter and stormwater lines.

CONCLUSION

Council is constructing indented bus bays and a pedestrian refuge in Cobbitty Road, Cobbitty, with associated signage and linemarking. It is recommended that the Committee supports the proposal.



RECOMMENDED

The Local Traffic Committee recommends that Council approves in Cobbitty Road, Cobbitty, between the intersections with Governor Drive and Nectarine Crescent, as detailed in Plan No. 2019-043 (Sheet 9):

- i. indented bus bays with Bus Zone restrictions (R5-20 signage) on the either side of the road; and
- ii. A pedestrian refuge island with associated signage and linemarking.
