Background

Transport for NSW (TfNSW) is legislated as the Authority responsible for the control of traffic on all NSW Roads. In order to deal with the large number and range of traffic related matters, TfNSW has delegated certain aspects of the control of traffic on local roads to Council (under the Transport Administration Act 1988). To exercise this delegation, Councils must establish a Local Traffic Committee (LTC) and obtain the advice of the TfNSW and NSW Police.

Role of the Committee

The LTC is primarily a technical review and advisory committee which considers the technical merits of proposals and ensures that current technical guidelines are considered. It provides recommendations to Council on traffic and parking control matters and the provision of traffic control facilities and prescribed traffic control devices for which Council has delegated authority. The Committee also advises on traffic matters arising from development applications (regulatory signage and line marking only), special events and road safety issues.

Committee Delegations

The LTC has no decision-making powers. Council must refer all traffic related matters to the Local Traffic Committee prior to exercising its delegated functions. Matters related to State Roads or functions that have not been delegated to Council must be referred directly to the TfNSW or relevant organisation.

The Committee provides recommendations to Council. Council is not bound by the advice of its LTC. Council can choose not to proceed with a recommendation of the Local Traffic Committee by not endorsing it at a Council Meeting where the minutes are presented.

Should Council wish to act contrary to the advice of the Committee or if that advice is not supported unanimously by the Committee members, Council must write to both the TfNSW and NSW Police, who may then choose to appeal to the Regional Traffic Committee within 14 days.

Committee Membership

The LTC is made up of four formal voting members. The members are as follows:

- one representative of Council as nominated by Council;
- one representative of the NSW Police from each Local Area Command (LAC) within the LGA;
- one representative from the TfNSW; and
- the local State Member(s) of Parliament (MP) or their nominee.

Where the Council area is represented by more than one MP or covered by more than one Police LAC, representatives are only permitted to vote on matters within their electorate or LAC.

The role of the four voting members is to:

- review the information provided to the committee.
- advise whether or not the technical justification of facilities meet the relevant guidelines and standards (facilities include lines, signs and devices).
- ensure that the recommendations conform to the matters being referred to and should be recommended for Council to endorse.

In relation to this:

- I. The council representatives and Local Members of Parliament (or representative) typically consider the interests of Council and its constituents. Both representatives on the Committee provide valued local knowledge.
- II. The Transport for NSW (TfNSW) representative provides advice on compliance of the matters with regards to various standards and guidelines.
- III. The NSW Police representative provides input on implications for the road network, particularly where a proposal may affect road safety.

The Committee may also have additional informal (non-voting) advisors. These may include:

- Council Officers
- Chamber of Commerce representatives
- Bus Operator representatives
- Other representatives as determined from time to time.

The informal advisors are not required to attend every LTC meeting. Their attendance is only necessary when items appear on the Agenda which affect their area of expertise or responsibility. The informal advisors are not entitled to a vote.

Please note there is no public gallery for these meetings.

LTC Business Paper

Council is responsible for preparing an LTC agenda and circulates to all formal members and informal advisors of the committee approximately one week prior to the meeting. This will allow members to fully consider the issues and determine their response on each item.

Council encourages each member of the LTC to undertake a site visit prior to considering any proposal. Site visits may be undertaken individually or organised with Council's Traffic Engineer(s).

SUBJECT:SPRING HILL CIRCLE, CURRANS HILL - SPEED CUSHIONSFROM:Director Community AssetsTRIM #:21/89315

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence for the installation of speed cushions along Spring Hill Circle, Currans Hill, between Glenfield Drive and Farmhouse Place.

BACKGROUND

To address resident concerns related to speeding on Spring Hill Circle, speed cushions are proposed to reduce speeds in the vicinity of the existing bridge.

MAIN REPORT

Spring Hill Circle, Currans Hill, has a humpback bridge situated between Glenfield Drive and Farmhouse Place. There is a footpath along the northern side and pedestrian kerb ramps 15 metres west of the bridge near the intersection with Glenfield Drive which are not clearly visible from the east side of the bridge. Advisory 25km/h and 'slowpoint' signage is in place due to the pronounced changes in grades.

A traffic survey was undertaken in November 2020 showing the 85th percentile speed to be 46km/h.

Speed cushions are considered an appropriate solution to encourage motorists to slow down and travel at the advisory speed limit. This section of Spring Hill Circle is not a current bus route however wider vehicles would be able to straddle the cushions. Speed hump warning signage and advanced warning signage would be installed together with hump markings in accordance with Australian Standard AS 1742.13. A similar treatment has been installed elsewhere on Spring Hill Circle.

Consultation has been undertaken with affected owners and occupiers in the vicinity, also advising of the potential noise implications. One response was received in support and requested additional humps be considered on other roads within Currans Hill.

FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

It is proposed that the installation cost be funded from Council's Minor Traffic Facilities budget for the 2021/22 financial year.

CONCLUSION

It is considered that the speed cushions would cater for improved pedestrian and motorist safety at the bridge in Spring Hill Circle and it is recommended that the committee support these facilities.




The Local Traffic Committee recommends that Council approve in Spring Hill Circle, Currans Hill, between Glenfield Drive and Farmhouse Place, two sets of speed cushions with associated signage (w3-4 and w5-10).



SUBJECT: ASTLEY ROAD, CATHERINE FIELD - GIVE WAY TREATMENT AT THE INTERSECTION WITH GIBBS CRESCENT

FROM:Director Community AssetsTRIM #:21/97526

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence for the installation of a Give Way treatment at Astley Road, Catherine Field, at the intersection with Gibbs Crescent / Wilhelm Parade.

BACKGROUND

Concern has been raised regarding traffic safety at a four-way intersection on Astley Road that does not have priority treatment. To address this, Give Way signage and linemarking is proposed.

MAIN REPORT

Astley Road, Gibbs Crescent and Wilhelm Parade are all 7.2 metre-wide local roads with a default speed limit of 50km/h. Gibbs Crescent and Wilhelm Parade narrow at the four-way intersection with Astley Road indicating Astley Road as the primary access. Give Way lines and signage are therefore proposed for Gibbs Crescent and Wilhelm Parade (**See Attachment 1**).

FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

The estimated cost of the recommended signage and line marking is \$1,000. It is proposed that the cost be funded from the TfNSW Block Grant (Traffic Facilities Component) for the 2021/22 financial year.

CONCLUSION

An assessment has indicated that priority controls are needed at the intersection of Astley Road with Gibbs Crescent and Wilhelm Parade, Catherine Field. Give Way signage and markings are recommended.


RECOMMENDED

The Local Traffic Committee recommends that Council approves in Astley Road, Catherine Field, Give Way signs (R1-2) and associated line marking (TB & TB1) at the intersection with Gibbs Crescent and Wilhelm Parade.

SUBJECT:HEATH ROAD, LEPPINGTON - GIVE WAY TREATMENT AT
EASTWOOD ROADFROM:Director Community Assets

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence for the installation of a Give Way sign and line marking at Heath Road, Leppington, at the intersection with Eastwood Road.

BACKGROUND

Concern has been raised regarding traffic safety at the intersection of Heath Road at the intersection with Eastwood Road. To address this, Give Way signage and line marking is proposed.

MAIN REPORT

Heath Road and Eastwood Road are rural roads in Leppington with 70km/h speeds limits, recently reduced from 80km/h. There is a slight rise on Heath Road on the approach which partially obscures the intersection. The area on the north side of Heath Road has be rezoned for residential development as Leppington Precinct Stage 1. Subdivision is already occurring leading to additional traffic in the area. Heath Road is identified in the development contribution plan for future urban upgrade.

There have been two relatively recent recorded crashes where people have failed to give way. Barrier boards are in place opposite the intersection. Council is installing a warning sign on the approach to the intersection. In addition, on the advice of Police, Give Way signage and line marking is proposed to further advise drivers (see **Attachment 1**).

There are no residences in the immediate vicinity of the intersection.

FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

The estimated cost of the recommended signage and line marking is \$500. It is proposed that the cost be funded from the TfNSW Block Grant (Traffic Facilities Component) for the 2021/22 financial year.

CONCLUSION

Following concerns raised regarding traffic safety at the intersection of Heath Road with Eastwood Road, it is recommended that a Give Way sign age and line marking be installed.




RECOMMENDED

The Local Traffic Committee recommends that Council approves in Heath Road, Leppington, a Give Way sign (R1-2) and associated line marking (TB & TB1) at the intersection with Eastwood Road.

SUBJECT:LILLYWHITECIRCUIT/STATTONROAD,ORANPARK-CENTRELINESFROM:Director Community AssetsTRIM #:21/98058

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence for the installation of double barrier lines around bends on Lillywhite Circuit and Stratton Road, Oran Park.

BACKGROUND

Concerns have been raised regarding speeding around curves in Lillywhite Circuit and Stratton Road creating road safety hazard. To address this issue, Centreline marking is proposed.

MAIN REPORT

Lillywhite Circuit and Stratton Road are local roads with sections running in parallel with Oran Park Drive, at 7.6 metres in width. Due to the narrow nature of the roads, double barrier lines 20 metres in length are recommended around the 90-degree bends in the roads. This is to assist in managing traffic and ensure lines of sight are maintained (**See Attachment 1**). The double barrier lines will legally restrict parking along the adjacent kerb line due to the width of the roadway.

There are currently no adjacent properties at these locations.

FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

It is proposed that the cost of the installation be funded from the TfNSW Block Grant (Local Traffic Facilities component) for the 2021/22 financial year at an approximate cost of \$500.

CONCLUSION

Concern has been raised regarding motorists speeding on curves in Lillywhite Circuit and Stratton Road, creating road safety concerns, and it is recommended that the Committee supports double barrier lines to address the issue.

RECOMMENDED


The Local Traffic Committee recommends that Council approves in Lillywhite Circuit and Stratton Road, Oran Park, 20 metres of double barrier (BB) lines around the curves at the southern and northern ends, respectively.

SUBJECT: RABY ROAD, GLEDSWOOD HILLS - NO U-TURN AT LAKESIDE GOLF CLUB ACCESS ROAD

FROM:Director Community AssetsTRIM #:21/100482

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To seek Local Traffic Committee Concurrence for a No U-turn sign on Raby Road at Lakeside Golf Club.

BACKGROUND

U-turning is occurring on Raby Road at the Lakeside Golf Club access which is causing a safety concern. A No U-turn sign is proposed.

MAIN REPORT

Raby Road is a dual-carriageway sub-arterial road. Vehicles have been observed exiting the Emerald Hills commercial precinct and u-turning at the Lakeside Golf Club access. A No U-turn sign is proposed to deter this activity (see **Attachment 1**).

FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

It is proposed that the cost of the installation be funded from the TfNSW Block Grant (Traffic Facilities Component) for the 2020/21 financial year at an approximate cost of \$300.

CONCLUSION

Concern has been raised about u-turning in Raby Road and a No U-turn sign is recommended to address the issue.


RECOMMENDED

The Local Traffic Committee recommends that Council approves in Raby Road, Gledswood Hills, a No U-turn sign (R2-5n) at the intersection with the Lakeside Golf Club access road.

SUBJECT:COBBITTY ROAD, COBBITTY - TIMED BUS ZONESFROM:Director Community AssetsTRIM #:21/118292

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence for implementing timed bus zones along Cobbitty Road in the vicinity of Cobbitty Public School.

BACKGROUND

Cobbitty Public School has expressed concern regarding compromised safety associated with the existing off-street bus facility and has concurred that buses be accommodated on-street to alleviate the potential of conflict on the school site.

MAIN REPORT

Cobbitty Public School is located along Cobbitty Road. The school currently accommodates school buses in an off street turning area that is also utilised by cars. Due to safety concerns about the conflict between buses, cars and pedestrians, the school in consultation with Council has concurred to an alternative arrangement with on-street Bus Zones. In November 2020 the Local Traffic Committee supported an upgrade the existing the pedestrian crossing, along the school frontage, to a hybrid crossing.

Timed Bus Zones (8am-9:30am, 2:30pm-4pm School Days) are therefore proposed on both sides of Cobbitty Road, at the school frontage, on the departure sides of the crossing.

On the school (southern) side, the school has requested for the Bus Zone to be on the approach to the crossing rather than the departure to better align with their internal arrangements. However, this would impede visibility of the crossing. Council is therefore progressing a separate project to indent the kerb and relocate the Bus Zone, minimising the impact on the crossing. A design will be undertaken and the plan presented to the Committee at a future meeting.

Consultation was also undertaken with residents impacted by the timed bus zone on the northern side of Cobbitty Road. No responses were received.

FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

It is proposed that the cost of the signage installation be funded from the TfNSW Block Grant (Traffic Facilities Component) for the 2021/22 financial year at an approximate cost of \$1,200.



CONCLUSION

Concern has been raised regarding the existing off-street bus facility resulting in compromised student safety, it is proposed to implement on-street bus zones to alleviate the concerns.

RECOMMENDED

The Local Traffic Committee recommends that Council approves in Cobbitty Road, Cobbitty, adjacent to Cobbitty Public School:

- i. A timed Bus Zone (8am-9:30am, 2:30pm-4pm school days) on the northern side, for 15 metres east of the hybrid crossing; and
- ii. A timed Bus Zone (8am-9:30am, 2:30pm-4pm school days) on the southern side, for 19 metres west of the hybrid crossing.

SUBJECT: JANE COURT, NARELLAN VALE - PARKING RESTRICTIONS IN TURNING HEAD

FROM:Director Community AssetsTRIM #:21/118913

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence for the installation of No Parking restrictions on the turning head within Jane Court, Narellan Vale.

BACKGROUND

Resident has raised concern regarding the inability to exit the residential driveway when vehicles are parked within the turning head.

MAIN REPORT

Jane Court is a cul-de-sac road in Narellan Vale which provides access to the local residences. The western section of Jane Court has two turning heads, one on the northern end and one on the southern end. Council has installed advisory signs requesting motorists not to park within the turning head. Council has received correspondence requesting regulatory signs be implemented particularly at the northern end due to parked vehicles impacting on the ability of vehicles to manoeuvre from the adjacent property.

It is proposed that No parking restrictions (R5-40 signage) are implemented as shown in **Attachment 1**.

The adjacent residents have been consulted. One response was received opposing the restriction noting that they felt the measures to be excessive.

FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

The proposed signage is estimated to cost \$600. It is proposed that the cost be funded from the TfNSW Block Grant (Traffic Facilities Component) for the 2021/22 financial year.

CONCLUSION

Concerns have been raised regarding the inability of a resident to manoeuvre from the driveway when a vehicle is parked in the turning head and it is proposed that regulatory No Parking restrictions are implemented.




RECOMMENDED

The Local Traffic Committee recommends that Council approves in Jane Court, Narellan Vale, No Parking restrictions (R5-40 signage) at the northern turning head.

SUBJECT: JAMBOREE AVENUE, LEPPINGTON - GIVE WAY CONTROLS AT INTERSECTIONS WITH PALAVAR STREET, KONARA STREET AND MINDARA STREET

FROM:Director Community AssetsTRIM #:21/119131

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence for the installation of Give Way treatments at Palavar Street, Konara Street and Mindara Street, Leppington at the intersections with Jamboree Avenue.

BACKGROUND

Concern has been raised regarding safety at the intersections of Palavar Street, Konara Street and Mindara Street with Jamboree Avenue.

MAIN REPORT

Palavar Street, Konara Street and Mindara Street are local roads with default speed limits of 50km/h.

Kinara Street forms a leg in a 4-leg intersection whilst Palavar Street and Mindara Street form a T-intersection with Jamboree Avenue. Council received correspondence advising that safety at these intersections is compromised particularly in evenings when kerbside parking is occupied. Inspections identified that motorists were not approaching the intersection close enough to have a clear view of oncoming vehicles but rather standing back away from the intersection. It is therefore proposed to implement Give Way treatments in order to provide motorists with a guide on where to wait at the intersection.

Owners and occupiers in the vicinity of the proposal have been consulted. No responses were received.

FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

It is proposed that the signage and line marking be funded from the TfNSW Block Grant (Traffic Facilities Component) for the 2021/22 financial year at an approximate cost of \$3,000.

CONCLUSION

Concern has been raised regarding sightlines at the intersections of Palavar Street, Konara Street and Mindara Street with Jamboree Avenue and it is proposed to implement Give Way treatments to address the issue.




RECOMMENDED

The Local Traffic Committee recommends that Council approves give way controls at the intersections of Palaver Street, Konara Street and Mindara Street with Jamboree Avenue, Leppington.

- i. Give Way treatments (R1-2 signage and TB and TB1 Line marking); and
- ii. Double barrier (BB) centrelines for 10 metres on the side roads.

SUBJECT: SMEATON GRANGE ROAD, SMEATON GRANGE - PARKING RESTRICTIONS AT ORIELTON ROAD

FROM:Director Community AssetsTRIM #:21/132791

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence for the installation of No Stopping restrictions and No Parking restrictions for heavy vehicles at the intersection of Smeaton Grange Road with Orielton Road.

BACKGROUND

Concern has been raised regarding heavy vehicles parking close to the intersection, restricting sightlines at the intersection. Formal restrictions are proposed to address this.

MAIN REPORT

Smeaton Grange Road and Orielton Road are both industrial roads and are just under 13 metres wide. Smeaton Grange Road is signposted at 60km/h and full-time heavy vehicle parking is permitted on the southern side between Camden Valley Way and Anzac Avenue. Orielton Road has a default speed limit of 50km/h.

A number of complaints have been received regarding poor intersection visibilities when exiting Orielton Road onto Smeaton Grange Road as heavy vehicles are often parked on Smeaton Grange Road near the intersection. There have been a number of reported near misses.

In order to address the concerns raised, it is proposed to implement to reinforce 10 meters statutory No Stopping at all approaches to the intersection and additional 30 meters of No Parking " Motor Vehicles under 4.5T GVM excepted" on Smeaton Grange Road either side of the intersection (**Attachment 1**).

Consultation was undertaken with adjacent owners and occupants regarding the proposal. Two responses were received in support of the proposal. One respondent suggested that heavy vehicle parking restrictions should be extended on the other side of Smeaton Grange Road to assist with traffic flows at the intersection. Another respondent suggested that no stopping restrictions should be installed instead of just parking restrictions for heavy vehicles as intersection visibilities are significantly reduced if any vehicle is parked at the intersection.

Council's comment

Site assessments have indicated that line of sight for vehicles seeking to exit Orielton Road on to Smeaton Grange Road will be obstructed if heavy vehicles are parked within 30 meters of the intersection. The proposed 10 meters statutory no stopping plus



an additional 30 meters of no heavy vehicle parking zone at the intersection will greatly improve sightlines at this location and are considered a suitable compromise.

FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

It is proposed that the cost of the signage be funded from the TfNSW Block Grant (Traffic Facilities Component) for the 2021/22 financial year at an approximate cost of \$1,800.

CONCLUSION

Following concern about heavy vehicles being parked close to the intersection of Smeaton Grange Road and Orielton Road, limiting intersection visibilities and creating road safety concerns, it is recommended the Committee supports the proposed parking restrictions.

RECOMMENDED

The Local Traffic Committee recommends that Council approves in Smeaton Grange Road, Smeaton Grange:

- i. 10 metres of No Stopping (R5-400 signage) on both corners of the intersection with Orielton Road, and
- ii. 30 metres of No Parking "Motor vehicles under 4.5T GVM excepted" (R5-41-3 signage) on either side of Orielton Road.

BACKGROUND

Concern has been raised regarding motorists not maintaining their lane and compromising safety when manoeuvring between River Road and Purcell Street. Double barrier centrelines are proposed to help address the issue.

MAIN REPORT

River Road intersects with Purcell Street at a priority control where the western section of River Road forms a no through road and a give way control where it intersects with Purcell Street.

Residents have reported concern regarding motorists not maintaining their lane when traveling between Purcell Street and River Road compromising safety of oncoming vehicles. It is proposed to install 10 metres of double barrier (BB) lines at the intersection.

Consultation was undertaken with adjacent owners and occupants regarding the proposed line marking. One response was received in support of the proposal.

FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

It is proposed that the cost of the installation be funded from the TfNSW Block Grant (Traffic Facilities Component) for the 2021/22 financial year at an approximate cost of \$600.

CONCLUSION

Concern was raised about vehicles not maintaining their lane and it is recommended that double centre barrier (BB) lines be supported to address the issue.



RECOMMENDED



It is proposed that the cost of the installation be funded from the RMS Block Grant (Traffic Facilities component) for the 2020/21 financial year at an approximate cost of \$1200.

CONCLUSION

Concerns have been raised about vehicles parking in a manner which obstructs access and sightlines at the pedestrian ramps, and it is proposed that No Stopping restrictions are installed.

RECOMMENDED








2. LOCATION MAP


Camden's Anzac Day March noting the roads affected by the first closure (in yellow) and the second closure (in red).

4. WORKPLACE HEALTH & SAFETY

4.1. RISK ASSESSMENT PLANS

A Risk Management approach is a fundamental part of the planning for any event. The safety risk identification, assessment and control processes are legal obligations (as per the WHS Act and Regulation 2011) and should be aligned with AS/NZS ISO 31000 Risk Management – Principles and Guidelines. Broader event risk management is best practice and a fundamental part of due diligence.

The event organisers as the ground hirers/owners will be the principal risk manager for the event and shall ensure that the risk management methodologies are applied throughout all stages and aspects of the event activities.

A comprehensive Risk Assessment will be conducted for Anzac Day and can be made available by contacting the Event Manager as listed in section 1.4 of this TMP.

4.2. PUBLIC LIABILITY INSURANCE

Camden Council has Public Liability Insurance to the value of \$20,000,000. This policy covers all activities taking place as part of Anzac Day. Please refer to attached copy of this policy.

4.3. NSW POLICE FORCE

The Camden Local Area Command (LAC) will be involved in the planning of Anzac Day via Council's Traffic Committee including aspects relating to use of the roadway, closure of selected roads and hostile vehicle mitigation, if deemed a requirement. They will be formally notified at least two weeks prior to the event taking place.

4.4. NSW FIRE & RESCUE AND NSW AMBULANCE

NSW Fire & Rescue and NSW Ambulance will be notified at least two weeks prior to the event taking place. This will also include direct notification to Camden Hospital.



4.5. EVENT DELAYS, POSTPONEMENT OR CANCELLATION


Any decision to delay, postpone or cancel the event due to weather impacts or any other reason will be made by the Event Organiser and follow their protocols for emergency management. Once any decision is made in this regard it will be communicated to all relevant stakeholders as per the event's Emergency Management Plan.



5. TRAFFIC AND TRANSPORT MANAGEMENT

5.1. EVENT IMPACT ON ROAD NETWORK

A map of the event locations is shown below, noting the road closures in place and the detour routes around the closures. The detour around Mitchell Street via Oxley Street and Argyle Street, as well as the detour around Cawdor Road via Barsden, Broughton and Murray Streets are deemed to be minimal disruptions.

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The impact is deemed acceptable given the importance of this national day of remembrance, as well as the fact that these closures are significantly smaller than those implemented at a similar time of year for many years.

A Traffic Guidance System (TGS) will be implemented for the closures and detours noted above. Refer to the attachment to this TMP for the TGS.

5.2. VEHICLE ACCESS TO THE EVENT SITE

Limited access to the event site and road closure will be permitted for product and service suppliers for the event as follows:

- + From 6.45am to 8.30am for the fencing install vehicles on Mitchell Street and around the Onslow Oval site
- + From 8.30am to 10.30am for the fencing install vehicle on Cawdor Road
- + From 10.45am to 12.00pm for the fencing removal vehicles across the whole area

All vehicle access will be at the discretion of the Event Manager and traffic controllers on duty at the time to ensure public safety and will be strictly limited to walking pace only.

5.3. PARKING

Approximately 200 parking spaces around the Onslow oval area will be blocked off from use during the road closures. As detailed below, parking will also be restricted along Cawdor Road from the night before the event and the 40 parking spaces in the off-road parking area adjacent to the cenotaph at Camden Bicentennial Park will also be closed on the event morning.

There is significant other parking in the streets surrounding the event site and parking is also available in dedicated car parks within the Camden town centre. Access to all other parking locations will be maintained through the majority of the day.

5.4. CHANGES TO ON-STREET PARKING CONDITIONS

Camden Council will erect no-parking/clearway signage along the following streets in advance of 25 April 2021:

- Mitchell Street between Cawdor Road and the swimming pool.
- + Cawdor Road (both sides) between Murray Street and Barsden Street, including the off-road parking area at Camden Bicentennial Park.

To ensure this area is clear for spectators and fencing installation on the event day, CATO will also barricade parking spaces on both sides of Cawdor Road between Mitchell Street and the RSL Club entry driveway from 4.00pm the day before the event. Any vehicles still parked along any of the above streets in the morning of the event will have a leaflet placed on them notifying the driver to contact event organisers to ensure their vehicle can be moved safely.

5.5. IMPACTS ON PUBLIC TRANSPORT

Anzac Day will be held in Camden on Sunday 25 April, a public holiday. Local buses will operate on a public holiday timetable and will not be impacted by the event as no services are scheduled to travel through the site on this day. The impact on public transport will be as follows:

5.5.1. BUSES

No impact due to no services operating

5.5.2. TAXIS AND RIDE-SHARE PROVIDERS

Taxis and ride-share providers will continue to have access to the road network around the closures as per other road users.

5.6. CHANGES TO CYCLE ROUTES

The closures of Mitchell Street and Cawdor Road will include the restriction of bicycles wishing to travel through the site. As with other vehicles, cyclists will be required to follow the detour around the site.



5.7. PEDESTRIAN MANAGEMENT AND HOSTILE VEHICLE MITIGATION (HVM)

As part of Camden Council's COVID-19 Safety Plan for the event, pedestrian access will be limited to numbers approved within the Plan (5,000 at the time of publication). Security personnel will patrol the perimeter of the site and dedicated pedestrian access points will be established at the northern and southern ends of the event area. Once capacity is reached, pedestrians will not be permitted access to the site until after the March is completed.

Hostile vehicle mitigation (HVM) barriers will be placed at each entry point at the direction of Council staff to prevent access to the site by unauthorised vehicles. A driver for each vehicle will always be present in case the vehicle needs to be moved to allow access for emergency vehicles.

5.8. RE-OPENING ROADS AFTER THE EVENT

The road closures on Mitchell Street and Cawdor Road for the Anzac Day March are planned to re-open at midday however this may occur earlier if the road is clear and the Event Organiser and traffic controllers on duty deem it is safe to do so.

6. MINIMISING IMPACT ON THE NON-EVENT COMMUNITY

6.1. ACCESS FOR LOCAL RESIDENTS AND BUSINESSES

The road closure areas for the Anzac Day March are deemed minimal, with access restricted to only a handful of properties. The Event Organiser will notify all residents and businesses impacted by the event including confirmation of the restricted vehicle movements during the event operating times. This will include reviewing any requirements for changes to commercial waste collection times and/or locations.

6.2. ACCESS FOR EMERGENCY VEHICLES

Emergency service vehicles will have unobstructed access into the event site if required via any of the normal road entry points. A driver for all HVM vehicles will always be present in case the vehicle needs to be moved to allow access for emergency vehicles.

6.3. ADVERTISING TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT ARRANGEMENTS

The Event Organiser will advertise the road closures in local print media, social media and on Council's website. A letterbox drop will be conducted to all resident and businesses in the immediately vicinity of the event sites and road closures as well as the surrounding streets in Camden. VMS will also be placed on approach roads to the closure (see below) to alert road users.

6.4. EVENT PROMOTION

The Event Organiser will promote Anzac Day in Camden and the road closures taking place using a variety of methods in the weeks preceding the event including:

- + Camden Council's social media platforms
- + Camden Council's website



6.5. VARIABLE MESSAGE SIGNS

Three Variable Message Signs (VMS) will be used on approach roads to the event location to advice road users of the event and changes taking place to the road network. These will be placed as follows:

- + Western side of Cawdor Road south of Barsden Street facing south
- + Western side of Murray Street south of Argyle Street facing south
- + Southern side of Argyle Street east of Murray Street facing east
