Local Traffic Committee

Background

Transport for NSW (TfNSW) is legislated as the Authority responsible for the control of traffic on all NSW Roads. In order to deal with the large number and range of traffic related matters, TfNSW has delegated certain aspects of the control of traffic on local roads to Council (under the Transport Administration Act 1988). To exercise this delegation, Councils must establish a Local Traffic Committee (LTC) and obtain the advice of the TfNSW and NSW Police.

Role of the Committee

The LTC is primarily a technical review and advisory committee which considers the technical merits of proposals and ensures that current technical guidelines are considered. It provides recommendations to Council on traffic and parking control matters and the provision of traffic control facilities and prescribed traffic control devices for which Council has delegated authority. The Committee also advises on traffic matters arising from development applications (regulatory signage and line marking only), special events and road safety issues.

Committee Delegations

The LTC has no decision-making powers. Council must refer all traffic related matters to the Local Traffic Committee prior to exercising its delegated functions. Matters related to State Roads or functions that have not been delegated to Council must be referred directly to the TfNSW or relevant organisation.

The Committee provides recommendations to Council. Council is not bound by the advice of its LTC. Council can choose not to proceed with a recommendation of the Local Traffic Committee by not endorsing it at a Council Meeting where the minutes are presented.

Should Council wish to act contrary to the advice of the Committee or if that advice is not supported unanimously by the Committee members, Council must write to both the TfNSW and NSW Police, who may then choose to appeal to the Regional Traffic Committee within 14 days.

Committee Membership

The LTC is made up of four formal voting members. The members are as follows:

- one representative of Council as nominated by Council;
- one representative of the NSW Police from each Local Area Command (LAC) within the LGA;
- one representative from the TfNSW; and
- the local State Member(s) of Parliament (MP) or their nominee.

Where the Council area is represented by more than one MP or covered by more than one Police LAC, representatives are only permitted to vote on matters within their electorate or LAC.



The role of the four voting members is to:

- review the information provided to the committee.
- advise whether or not the technical justification of facilities meet the relevant guidelines and standards (facilities include lines, signs and devices).
- ensure that the recommendations conform to the matters being referred to and should be recommended for Council to endorse.

In relation to this:

- I. The council representatives and Local Members of Parliament (or representative) typically consider the interests of Council and its constituents. Both representatives on the Committee provide valued local knowledge.
- II. The Transport for NSW (TfNSW) representative provides advice on compliance of the matters with regards to various standards and guidelines.
- III. The NSW Police representative provides input on implications for the road network, particularly where a proposal may affect road safety.

The Committee may also have additional informal (non-voting) advisors. These may include:

- Council Officers
- Chamber of Commerce representatives
- Bus Operator representatives
- Other representatives as determined from time to time.

The informal advisors are not required to attend every LTC meeting. Their attendance is only necessary when items appear on the Agenda which affect their area of expertise or responsibility. The informal advisors are not entitled to a vote.

Please note there is no public gallery for these meetings.

LTC Business Paper

Council is responsible for preparing an LTC agenda and circulates to all formal members and informal advisors of the committee approximately one week prior to the meeting. This will allow members to fully consider the issues and determine their response on each item.

Council encourages each member of the LTC to undertake a site visit prior to considering any proposal. Site visits may be undertaken individually or organised with Council's Traffic Engineer(s).

SUBJECT: LOWNDES DRIVE, ORAN PARK- CENTRE LINE-MARKING

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence for the installation of centre line-marking along Lowndes Drive, Oran Park.

BACKGROUND

Concerns have been raised regarding motorists traveling at speed along Lowndes Drive. Line-marking is proposed to address the issue.

MAIN REPORT

Lowndes Drive is primary access road in Oran Park that runs between Larkham Street and Skaife Street with a 90 degree bend in the middle. The southern section is 11 meters wide and the eastern section is 9.6 metres wide. There are intermittent kerb extensions. Parking is unrestricted and there is no line-marking, except for lengths of double barrier centreline approaching the roundabout at Skaife Street and around the bend. It has a speed limit of 50km/h.

Seven-day speed and volume counts were undertaken in the southern section in December 2021 indicating 85th percentile speeds of 56.0 km/h and an average daily volume of 1,843 vehicles.

To help address concerns with speeding it was proposed to install dashed centre line-marking along the length of the road.

Public consultation has been undertaken with affected owners and occupiers and two written responses have been received. Both are from the narrower eastern section of Lowndes Drive and did not support the line-marking saying it was unnecessary.

As the original complaints came for the wider southern section it is proposed to introduce dashed line-marking between the bend near Longhurst Street and Skaife Street only at this time. Double barrier lines are proposed for 10 metres on approaches to Cole Street.

FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

The estimated cost of the recommended work is \$1,500. It is proposed that the cost be funded from the TfNSW Block Grant (Traffic Facilities Component) for the 2022/23 financial year.



CONCLUSION


Concerns have been raised regarding driver behaviour in Lowndes Drive, Oran Park, and it is recommended that the Committee supports line marking to help address the issues.

RECOMMENDED

That the Local Traffic Committee recommends that Council approves in Lowndes Drive, Oran Park between the bend near Longhurst Street and Skaife Street, separation centre line-marking (S1) with 10 metres of double barrier centre line-marking (BB) on the approaches to Cole Street.

SUBJECT: PRICE RIDGE, LEPPINGTON - CENTRE LINE-MARKING

FROM: Acting Director Community Assets

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence for the modification of centre line-marking along Price Ridge, Leppington.

BACKGROUND

Concerns have been raised regarding motorists traveling at speed along Price Ridge and not keeping to the left through a section with reduced visibility. Modifying linemarking is proposed to address the issue.

MAIN REPORT

Price Ridge is a local collector road which measures 11 metres wide. The road has a curved section toward the southern end (**Attachment 1**). The section currently has broken centre line-marking. It has been reported that some motorists are overtaking along the curved section. This presents road safety concerns, and it is proposed to restrict this manoeuvre by implementing double barrier lines as depicted in **Attachment 2**.

Consultation was undertaken with adjacent owners and occupants regarding the proposed line marking. No responses were received.

FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

It is proposed that the cost of the installation be funded from the TfNSW Block Grant (Traffic Facilities component) for the 2021/22 financial year at the approximate cost of \$1,000.

CONCLUSION

Concerns have been raised about vehicles overtaking along the curved section along Price Ridge, Leppington and it is recommended that the double barrier line-marking be supported to address the concerns.

RECOMMENDED

The Local Traffic Committee recommends that Council approves in Price Ridge, Leppington, double centre line-marking (BB) along the curved section.



SUBJECT: HOLDEN DRIVE, ORAN PARK - CENTRE AND EDGE LINE-MARKING

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence for the installation of centre and edge line-marking and additional signage along Holden Drive, Oran Park.

BACKGROUND

Concerns have been raised regarding motorists traveling at speed along Holden Drive. Line-marking is proposed to address the issue.

MAIN REPORT

Holden Drive is a collector road in Oran Park that runs between Peter Brock Drive and South Circuit (**Attachment 1**). The road between Steward Street and South Circuit is 11 metres wide. The road has a speed limit of 50km/h. There is a mid-point roundabout at the intersection with Evans Street which helps regulate traffic and speeds. Oran Park Public School and Oran Park High School are close by in South Circuit.

Seven-day speed and volume counts were undertaken in December 2021 indicating 85th percentile speeds of 51.2 km/h and an average daily volume of 4,476 vehicles.

To help address concerns raised about speeding, edge line-marking (E1) and dashed centre line-marking (S1) and is proposed Steward Street and South Circuit (see **Attachment 2**).

Public consultation has been undertaken with affected owners and occupiers and one written response has been received in support of the proposal.

FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

The estimated cost of the recommended work is \$2,000. It is proposed that the cost be funded from the TfNSW Block Grant (Traffic Facilities Component) for the 2022/23 financial year.

CONCLUSION

Concerns have been raised regarding driver behaviour in Holden Drive, Oran Park, and it is recommended that the Committee supports line-marking to help address the issues.

RECOMMENDED

The Local Traffic Committee recommends that Council approves in Holden Drive, Oran Park, as detailed in Drawing No. 2022-005, between Steward Drive and South Circuit, edge line-marking (E1) and separation line-marking (S1).



SUBJECT: FLINDERS AVENUE, CAMDEN SOUTH - EDGE LINE-MARKING

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence for the installation of edge lines in Flinders Avenue, Camden South.

BACKGROUND

Concern has been raised regarding driver behaviour when traveling southbound on Flinders Avenue around the curve towards Berallier Street as well as parking too close to the intersection and across the driveway to the rear of the shops. Line-marking is proposed to help address these concerns.

MAIN REPORT

Flinders Avenue is primary access road which measures 11 metres in width north of the intersection with Berallier Street where there is an existing double barrier centre line. It narrows south of the intersection. The street has unrestricted parking throughout but with 90-degree angled parking bays adjacent to the shops opposite Berallier Street (**Attachment 1**).

Drivers have been observed approaching the bend unsafely, which is further exacerbated by parked vehicles compromising sightlines at the intersection. To address delineation and sightline concerns raised by residents, it is proposed to implement edge lines from Cowper Drive to Berallier Drive. The lines will create travel lanes 3.3 metres wide, tapering at the intersections. Details are provided in **Attachment 2**.

Consultation was undertaken with adjacent owners and occupants regarding the proposed line making. One verbal response was received expressing concern that the line-marking would not stop people parking across the pram ramps near Berallier Drive and would prefer signage. As this would result is parking over the lines this would be in clear breach of the Road Rules and can be enforced. A written response was received raising no objection but requesting two-hour parking restrictions in front of the shops to deter all day parking.

FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

The estimated cost of the recommended work is \$2,000. It is proposed that the cost be funded from the TfNSW Block Grant (Traffic Facilities Component) for the 2022/23 financial year.

CONCLUSION

Concerns have been raised regarding driver behaviour in Flinders Avenue, Camden South, and it is recommended that the Committee supports line marking to help address the issues.

RECOMMENDED

That the Local Traffic Committee recommends that Council approves in Flinders Avenue, Camden South Edgelines (E1) between Cowper Drive and Berallier Street.



SUBJECT: JOHN STREET, CAMDEN - WOMBAT CROSSING

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence for the signage and line marking, associated with installing a wombat crossing along John Street, Camden.

BACKGROUND

Council has successfully secured funding under the Federal Stimulus Road Safety Program to install a wombat crossing at the existing children's crossing in John Street, Camden. This report details the associated signage, line-marking and devices.

MAIN REPORT

The Federal Government is providing funding for the construction of a wombat crossing in John Street, Camden, through the Federal Stimulus Road Safety Program. This program supports measures to encourage walking and enhance safety at schools. An overview plan is shown in **Attachment 1**.

A detailed proposal is shown Plan No, 2021-044 (Sheet 5) in **Attachment 2**. This includes a raised zebra crossing with line-marking and signage. The existing children's crossing line-marking and flags are proposed to be retained creating a hybrid crossing. There are existing kerb extensions and No Stopping restrictions along both kerb lines.

There are currently no adjacent properties except the school. Camden Public School were consulted on and support this proposal.

FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

The works are budgeted at \$200,000, funded by a grant from the Federal Stimulus Road Safety Program in the 2021/22 financial year, as approved by Council on 13 April 2021.

CONCLUSION


Council is planning to construct a wombat crossing in John Street, Camden, with associated signage and line-marking. It is recommended that the Committee supports the proposal.

RECOMMENDED

The Local Traffic Committee recommends that Council approves in John Street, Camden, adjacent Camden Public School, a wombat crossing with associated signage and line-marking as detailed in Plan No. 2021-044 (Sheet 5).

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence for the installation of centre and edge line-marking along Governor Drive, Harrington Park.

BACKGROUND

Concerns have been raised regarding motorists traveling at speed along Governor Drive and not keeping to the left. Line-marking is proposed to address the issue.

MAIN REPORT

Governor Drive is a collector road in Harrington Park that runs between Cobbitty Road and The Northern Road (**Attachment 1**). The majority of the road is 7.2 metres wide. The northern end between Cobbitty Road has carriageways 5 metres wide separated by a median island. The road has a speed limit of 50km/h. There are four roundabouts along the road which help regulate traffic and speeds. Residents report some traffic using Governor Drive to access Macarthur Anglican School from The Northern Road.

Seven-day speed and volume counts were undertaken in December 2021 indicating 85th percentile speeds of 53.8 km/h and an average daily volume of 3,099 vehicles. To help address concerns the following is proposed (**Attachment 2**):

- Edge line-marking (E1) between Cobbitty Road and Underwood Circuit creating 3-metre-wide travel lanes; and
- Separation line-marking (S1) between Underwood Circuit and Abercrombie Place.

Public consultation has been undertaken with affected owners and occupiers and six written responses have been received. Two responses did not think the line-marking would be effective and suggested speed enforcement. One also considered the road should be closed mid-way. Another response asked if the edge line would be yellow. Another response suggested speed humps and chicanes. One response was concerned that the edge line would restrict parking and suggested limiting access to local traffic only.

Based on the speed and volume counts, the line-marking treatment is considered proportionate at this time. Parking is not permitted by the Road Rules at intersections and the proposal would have no further impact on parking.

FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

The estimated cost of the recommended work is \$3,500. It is proposed that the cost be funded from the TfNSW Block Grant (Traffic Facilities Component) for the 2022/23 financial year.

CONCLUSION

Concerns have been raised regarding driver behaviour in Governor Drive, Harrington Park, and it is recommended that the Committee supports line-marking to help address the issues.





PURPOSE OF REPORT

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence for the installation of centre and edge line-marking and additional signage along O'Keefe Drive, Oran Park.

BACKGROUND

Concerns have been raised regarding motorists traveling at speed along O'Keefe Drive and not keeping to the left. Line-marking is proposed to address the issue.

MAIN REPORT

O'Keefe Drive is a collector road in Oran Park that runs between South Circuit and Catherine Park Drive (**Attachment 1**). The majority of the road is 11 metres wide. There are kerb extensions throughout the length of the road. The road has a speed limit of 50km/h. There two roundabouts along the road which help regulate traffic and speeds.

Seven-day speed and volume counts were undertaken towards the southern end in December 2021 indicating 85th percentile speeds of 56.7 km/h and an average daily volume of 1,999 vehicles. Volumes are expected to increase significant as the adjacent precinct develops.

To help address concerns the following is proposed between Banfield Drive and Myer Street (**Attachment 2**):

- Edge line-marking (E1);
- Double barrier centre line-marking (BB);
- Give Way line-marking (TB, TB1) and signage (R1-2) at Seidler Parade;
- Double barrier centre line-marking (BB) for 20 metres along Seidler Parade;
- Extension of No Stopping (R5-400) signage in the vicinity of Myer Street.

Public consultation has been undertaken and one response was received in support of the proposal.

FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

The estimated cost of the recommended work is \$5,000. It is proposed that the cost be funded from the TfNSW Block Grant (Traffic Facilities Component) for the 2022/23 financial year.

CONCLUSION

Concerns have been raised regarding driver behaviour in O'Keefe Drive, Oran Park, and it is recommended that the committee supports the signage and line-marking.



PURPOSE OF REPORT

To seek concurrence of the Local Traffic Committee for local area traffic management associated with the Narellan Town Centre High Pedestrian Activity Area.

BACKGROUND

Transport for New South Wales approaches Councils each year for potential slower speed projects. Funding has just been made available towards installation of a High Pedestrian Activity Area (40km/h zone) in Narellan Town Centre.

MAIN REPORT

High Pedestrian Activity Areas are appropriate in shopping precincts and around community services, with the maximum permanent 40km/h speed limit in these areas. The different road environment, reinforced by local area traffic management measures, helps alert drivers to the lower speed limit and provides increased awareness of the presence of pedestrians moving about or near the road. This creates a safer road environment for all road users, particularly for pedestrians, cyclists and children.

Last year Council was invited by TfNSW to consider developing a 40km/h High Pedestrian Activity Area in Narellan Town Centre. Council was already progressing raised zebra (wombat) crossings in Elyard Street and Queen Street. The design scope was therefore expanded to incorporate additional traffic management measures to support a self-enforcing 40km/h limit in Elyard Street, Queen Street and Somerset Avenue, as required by the program (Attachment 1). Details of the signage, linemarking and devices are provided in Attachment 2 as follows:

- Queen Street (towards Camden Valley Way): Threshold treatment including kerb blister and raised table:
- Queen Street (towards Elyard Street): Wombat crossing and kerb blisters;
- Elyard Street (towards Queen Street): Wombat crossing and kerb blisters;
- Elyard Street (midblock between Queen Street and Somerset Avenue): kerb blisters;
- Elyard Street (towards Somerset Avenue): kerb blisters and raised table;
- Somerset Avenue (at Elyard Street): kerb blisters and raised table;
- Somerset Avenue (towards Elyard Street): kerb blisters and raised table; and
- Somerset Avenue (towards Camden Valley Way): Threshold treatment including kerb blister.

Consultation has been undertaken with surrounding businesses and residents. Two responses were received from businesses. One on Queen Street sought to clarify their access would be unimpeded. Another on Somerset Avenue requested the existing bus stop be relocated. This is not compatible with the current proposal noting that the development zoning in Narellan Town Centre seeks to facilitate redevelopment of properties in Somerset Avenue.

FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

This project is funded from the Pedestrian Safety Program in 2021/22 and the Camden Contributions Plan into the 2022/23 financial year.

CONCLUSION

A High Pedestrian Activity Area is proposed in Queen Street, Elyard Street and Somerset Avenue in Narellan, with traffic management devices. It is recommended that the Committee supports the proposal.





PURPOSE OF REPORT

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence for the installation of zig-zag line-marking on the approaches to the zebra crossing on Macarthur Road, Elderslie.

BACKGROUND

Concerns have been raised regarding motorists not having clear sightlines to identify the location of the zebra crossing outside Mawarra Public School in Elderslie.

MAIN REPORT

Macarthur Road is a collector road, 11.6 metres wide. The existing zebra crossing is situated outside of Mawarra Public School and an adjacent childcare centre (**Attachment 1**).

The crossing is situated north of an S-bend which impedes visibility. On the southbound approach, a slight crest in the road also impacts on visibility of the crossing. Zig-zag lines are therefore proposed to advise motorists of a pedestrian crossing ahead. Details are provided in **Attachment 2**.

FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

It is proposed that the cost of installation be funded from the TfNSW Block Grant (Traffic Facilities Component) for the 2022/23 financial year at an approximate cost of \$1,500.

CONCLUSION



PURPOSE OF REPORT

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence for the installation of parking restrictions along Waler Crescent, Smeaton Grange.

BACKGROUND

Concern has been raised regarding sightline concerns when trucks are parked along a section of Waler Crescent, east of the sharp bend.

MAIN REPORT

Waler Crescent is a local road which measures 12.8 metres in width. The road is in an industrial area and contains sharp bends (**Attachment 1**). Motorists leaving the site on the north-western section have reported poor visibility of vehicles approaching from the bend when large vehicles are parked kerbside. The sites provide martial arts and gymnasium classes to children. It is therefore proposed to restrict parking along the approach to the driveway with the implementation of "No Parking Motor vehicles under 4.5t GVM Excepted" (R5-41-3) signage (**Attachment 2**).

Consultation was undertaken with adjacent owners and occupants regarding the proposed restrictions. Three responses were received. One response supported the proposal. The second response requested the restrictions be extended to the west to accommodate the adjacent site. As such plans were amended and the request incorporated. The third response requested the treatment be implemented along another section of Waler Crescent as the proposal would shift the parking issue along the road. It is recommended that the road is monitored post-installation to determine if the heavy vehicles would relocate to the requested location.

FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

It is proposed that the cost of signage be funded from the TfNSW Block Grant (Traffic Facilities Component) for the 2021/22 financial year at an approximate cost of \$1200.

CONCLUSION


Following concerns raised by motorists regarding sightlines being obstructed by large vehicles, it is proposed to install No Parking Motor vehicles under 4.5t GVM Excepted (R5-41-3) restrictions along the north-western section of Waler Crescent.

RECOMMENDED

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To document concurrence previously provided by the Local Traffic Committee through an Electronic Meeting for Mitchell Street & Cawdor Road Closure - Anzac Day 2022 - Special Event Transport Management Plan.

MAIN REPORT

The Camden RSL Sub-Branch will be conducting services to commemorate the 107th Anniversary of the Landing at Gallipoli on Saturday 25 April 2022. Camden Council works with the Sub-Branch to ensure appropriate measures are implemented to ensure a safe day and that traffic impacts are minimised on businesses, residents and visitors to Camden. In particular, Camden Council has prepared a COVID-19 Safety Plan and will implement measures to ensure the event complies with the NSW Government's guidelines for COVID safe events.

The following activity will take place on the event day:

- A Dawn Service will be conducted in the Camden Bicentennial Equestrian Park Memorial Site, Cawdor Road, Camden, commencing at 5.15am sharp.
- An ANZAC Day March commencing at 10.30am will move from Elizabeth Street, down Argyle Street and Cawdor Road to the Camden Bicentennial Equestrian Park.
- The ANZAC Day Community Service, commencing at 11.15 am.


Camden's ANZAC Day commemorations involve partial and full closures of the main road in the Camden CBD (Argyle Street and its extension, Cawdor Road) as well as Elizabeth Street (between Argyle Street and Mitchell Street) and sections of surrounding streets to safely facilitate the community activities taking place on the roads. Approximately 60m of parking on John Street (between Argyle Street and Larkin Place) will also be closed for equipment and vehicle storage during bump-in, the events and bump-out. The closures commence at 4.30am and change progressively through the day to finally reopen at 2.00pm.

While access is maintained for emergency and other vehicles servicing the event, all other traffic must detour around the full closure. Temporary bus stops will be implemented to divert buses around the road closures so that services can mostly be maintained.



Stage 2 - 9.30am

- The closure of Argyle Street between Edward Street and Oxley Street, includes
 - John Street between Larkin Place and 60 John Street (entrance to public car park)
 - Hill Street between Argyle Street and 21 Hill Street (entrance to public car park)
 - View Street at Argyle Street

Stage 3 - 10am

- Argyle Street and Cawdor Road between Oxley Street and Barsden Street (east of the entrance to the Caltex service station. Includes:
 - Closure of exit from Coles car park on Cawdor Road (south side, west of Murray Street)
 - Murray Street between Argyle Street and 20 Murray Street (entrance to public car park)
 - closure of exit from Woolworths car park on Argyle Street (north side, east of Murray Street)
 - Oxley Street between Argyle Street and 45 Oxley Street (entrance to Woolworths car park).


Public Transport

ANZAC Day will be held in Camden on Monday 25 April, a public holiday. Local buses will operate on a public holiday timetable and will therefore be minimal on the event day. Council has been liaising with the bus company regarding the road closure.

Attachment 1 provides detailed of Traffic Management Plan and Traffic Control Plan. The event has been determined as a Class 4 Event Category. Traffic Control Plans have been prepared to ensure appropriate traffic management measures are implemented as part of the road closures. It is recommended that the committee supports the proposed measures.

Due to the recent flood in Camden, a contingency plan has been investigated by Council for the Dawn Service. In the event that the ground in the Camden Bicentennial Equestrian Park Memorial Site is deemed unsuitable the day before the event, the following changes to the traffic management plan will be implemented.

- Cawdor Road between Barsden Street and Murray Street will be closed from 3.00am. Further, the inside lane for east-bound and outside lane for west-bound for Argyle Street between Murray Street and Elizabeth Street will also be closed.
- Cawdor Road between Mitchell Street and Murray Street will be re-open from 7.00am. All other closures on Cawdor Road and Argyle Street will remain in place.

	local bus companies being advised of the traffic management arrangements in writing, by the organisers; and ix. access is facilitated for vehicles turning from Cawdor Road into the service station on the corner of Cawdor Road and Barsden Street.

1. GENERAL EVENT INFORMATION

1.1. EVENT SUMMARY

The Camden RSL Sub-Branch will be conducting services to commemorate the 107th Anniversary of the Landing at Gallipoli on Saturday 25 April 2022. Camden Council works with the Sub-Branch to ensure appropriate measures are implemented to ensure a safe day and that traffic impacts are minimised on businesses, residents and visitors to Camden.

The following activities will take place on the event day:

- + A Dawn Service will be conducted in the Camden Bicentennial Equestrian Park Memorial Site, Cawdor Road, Camden, commencing at 5.15am sharp.
- + An ANZAC Day March commencing at 10.25am will move from Elizabeth Street, down Argyle Street and Cawdor Road to the Camden Bicentennial Equestrian Park
- + The ANZAC Day Community Service, commencing at 11.15 am.

It is expected that the Community Service will be completed and the road cleared by 12.00pm. In the event that recent wet weather and flooding makes the Camden Bicentennial Equestrian Park Memorial Site inaccessible or unsafe for public access, the services will be held on Cawdor Road adjacent to the Camden RSL Memorial Rose Garden. This will have no affect on traffic management planning.

1.2. TRAFFIC IMPACT SUMMARY

Camden's ANZAC Day commemorations involve partial and full closures of the main road in the Camden CBD (Argyle Street and its extension, Cawdor Road) as well as Elizabeth Street (between Argyle Street and Mitchell Street) and sections of surrounding streets to safely facilitate the community activities taking place on the roads. A section of parking at Onslow Oval will be closed to the public and exclusively used available only for people with limited mobility, and approximately 60m of parking on John Street (between Argyle Street and Larkin Place) will also be closed for equipment and vehicle storage during bump-in, the events and bump-out.



The closures commence at 4.30am and change progressively through the day to finally reopen at 2.00pm. Barricading of the parking area at Onslow Oval will commence at 5.00pm on Sunday 24 April.

While access is maintained for emergency and other vehicles servicing the event, all other traffic must detour around the full closure. Temporary bus stops will be implemented to divert buses around the road closures so that services can mostly be maintained. Over the closure period the impact is therefore on:

- + Local businesses in and around the closure area
- + Residents in and around the closure area
- + Buses, taxis and car-share providers
- + Casual road users coming to or passing through Camden

The event organisers (Camden Council) have engage an authorised traffic management company, Cato Location Services, to provide traffic management support for the event.



- + Cawdor Road between Barsden Street and Murray Street full road closure
- + Argyle Street between Murray Street and Edward Street full road closure
- + Murray Street between Argyle Street and 20 Murray Street (entrance to public car park) full road closure
- + Exit from Woolworths car park on Argyle Street (north side) between Murray Street and Oxley Street full road closure

3. EVENT SITE PLAN

4. WORKPLACE HEALTH & SAFETY

4.1. RISK ASSESSMENT PLANS

A Risk Management approach is a fundamental part of the planning for any event. The safety risk identification, assessment and control processes are legal obligations (as per the WHS Act and Regulation 2011) and should be aligned with AS/NZS ISO 31000 Risk Management – Principles and Guidelines. Broader event risk management is best practice and a fundamental part of due diligence.

The event organisers as the ground hirers/owners will be the principal risk manager for the event and shall ensure that the risk management methodologies are applied throughout all stages and aspects of the event activities.

A comprehensive Risk Assessment will be conducted for ANZAC Day and can be made available by contacting the Event Manager as listed in section 1.4 of this TMP.

4.2. PUBLIC LIABILITY INSURANCE

Camden Council has Public Liability Insurance to the value of \$20,000,000. This policy covers all activities taking place as part of ANZAC Day. Please refer to attached copy of this policy.

4.3. NSW POLICE FORCE

The Camden Police Area Command (PAC) will be involved in the planning of ANZAC Day via Council's Traffic Committee including aspects relating to use of the roadway, closure of selected roads and hostile vehicle mitigation. They will be formally notified at least two weeks prior to the event taking place.

4.4. NSW FIRE & RESCUE AND NSW AMBULANCE

NSW Fire & Rescue and NSW Ambulance will be notified at least two weeks prior to the event taking place. This will also include direct notification to Camden Hospital.



4.5. EVENT DELAYS, POSTPONEMENT OR CANCELLATION


Any decision to delay, postpone or cancel the event due to weather impacts or any other reason will be made by the Event Organiser and follow their protocols for emergency management. Once any decision is made in this regard it will be communicated to all relevant stakeholders as per the event's Emergency Management Plan.



5. TRAFFIC AND TRANSPORT MANAGEMENT

5.1. EVENT IMPACT ON ROAD NETWORK

A map of the event locations is shown below, noting the road closures in place and the detour routes around the closures. Every effort has been made to minimise the disruption to road users, residents and businesses by implementing only lane closures for sections of the day. Minor detours will be in place for the early morning Dawn Service closure (Cawdor Road near Barsden Street) and the march marshalling closure (Elizabeth and Mitchell Streets) however when the full Argyle Street road closure occurs, the detour is via the Camden Bypass.

Reason: Finalise set-up of fencing then management of march from

10.25am. Community Service continues on Cawdor Road from

11.15am to 12.00pm.



Detour: Via Barsden Street, Broughton Street, Old Hume Highway,

Camden Bypass, MacArthur Road, Argyle Street East and

Edward Street (shown in purple above).

Impacts: Major impact due to lengthy detour for all traffic via the

Camden Bypass until 12.00pm. Emergency vehicles are excepted. All north-south and east-west travel through the CBD ceases at 10.00am through until the end of the parade

and clearing of lanes at 12.00pm.

CLOSURE STAGE 6

Time: 12.00pm on Monday 25 April 2022

Location: Argyle Street between Murray Street and Elizabeth Street -

inside lane closed east-bound and outside (kerbside) lane

closed west-bound

Reason: Removal of fencing along Argyle Street. Crews will work from

both ends. The closure on Cawdor Road between Barsden and Mitchell Streets may extend slightly beyond 12.00pm to allow

for the road to clear after the Community Service.

Detour: N/A. One lane open in each direction along Argyle Street.

Impacts: Minimal impact due one lane each way remains open on Argyle

Street.

Impacts: Minor impact due to relatively easy access around the location.

Note that west-bound traffic remains unaffected.

CLOSURE STAGE 7

Time: 2.00pm on Monday 25 April 2022

Location: All lanes and roads re-opened to traffic.

Despite best efforts to minimise disruptions it is accepted that the closure of Cawdor Road as well as Elizabeth, Mitchell and Argyle Streets at various times through the day will have



a negative impact on the Camden CBD road network for the duration of the event. However, it is also acknowledged that the impact is acceptable given the importance of this national day of remembrance, as well as the fact that these same roads have been closed to hold the event at a similar time of year for many years.

Traffic Guidance Systems (TGSs) will be implemented for the closures and detours noted above. Refer to the attachments to this TMP for copies.

5.2. VEHICLE ACCESS TO THE EVENT SITE

Limited access to the event site and road closure will be permitted for product and service suppliers for the event as follows:

- + From 4.30am to 9.00am for the fencing install vehicles in the Argyle Street lane closures
- + From 8.30am to 9.00am for the fencing install vehicles in Elizabeth and Mitchell Streets, then in Argyle Street from 9.30am to 10.00am.
- + From 10.00am to 12.00pm for the fencing install vehicles along the remaining sections of Argyle Street including final installation of fencing across intersections and the progressive removal of fencing along Mitchell, Elizabeth and Argyle Streets behind the March.
- + From 12.00pm to 2.00pm for the ongoing fencing removal vehicles in the Argyle Street lane closures

In addition to the above, traffic controllers will allow the scheduled 895 bus service to pass northbound through the Argyle Street road closure at 10.20am. Fencing will be put in place after the bus has passed through the area ready the march.

Traffic controllers will also allow emergency access to the Elizabeth and Mitchell Street closures for residents, business operators and emergency vehicles. Access will not be permitted into these areas for business customers.

All vehicle access will be at the discretion of the Event Manager and traffic controllers on duty at the time to ensure public safety and will be strictly limited to walking pace only.



5.3. PARKING

The following changes to parking availability and conditions will be made in the Camden CBD:

5.3.1. PARKING REMOVAL

- + Approximately 60m of 45-degree angled parking on the west side of John Street (between Argyle Street and Larkin Place) will be closed to provide storage of fencing equipment and fencing vehicles during bump-in, the events and bump-out.
- + Approximately 40m of 45-degree angled parking on the east side of John Street (just north of Mitchell Street) will be closed to provide a temporary bus stop for southbound buses from 8.30am to 12.00 on event the day.

Camden Council will erect no-parking/clearway signage in these areas in advance of 25 April 2022 to prevent the public parking here during these times.

5.3.2. CHANGES TO ON-STREET PARKING CONDITIONS

Camden Council will erect no-parking/clearway signage along the following streets in advance of 25 April 2022:

- + The car park at Onslow Oval between the tennis courts and the Camden Show Hall will be closed off to general access before and during the Dawn Service. It will be exclusively available only for people with limited mobility. A parking marshal will allow access only to those vehicles with an authorised RMS Mobility Parking Permit.
- + Mitchell Street (both sides) between Elizabeth Street and Edward Street.
- + Elizabeth Street (both sides) between Mitchell Street and Argyle Street.
- + Argyle Street (both sides) between Edward Street and Murray Street.
- + Cawdor Road (both sides) between Murray Street and Barsden Street.

Any vehicles still parked along these streets in the morning of the event will have a leaflet placed on them notifying the driver to contact event organisers to ensure their vehicle can be moved safely.

There is significant other parking in the streets surrounding the event site and parking is also available in dedicated car parks within the Camden town centre. Other than those



noted above, access to almost all parking locations will be maintained through the majority of the day, even during the major closure period for the march.

5.4. IMPACTS ON PUBLIC TRANSPORT

ANZAC Day will be held in Camden on Monday 25 April, a public holiday. Local buses will operate on a public holiday timetable and will therefore be minimal on the event day with only one service running. The impact on public transport will be as follows:


5.4.1. BUSES

The 895 is the only bus services operating through the Camden CBD on a public holiday. Its movements will be managed as follows:

- + From 8.30am all buses will be diverted around the Mitchell and Elizabeth Street road closures via Edward. Exeter and John Streets, along with other traffic.
- + The final bus service permitted through Camden before the parade commences along Argyle Street will be the 10.20am northbound (Campbelltown) service.
- + The 10.57am southbound (Camden South) service and the 11.20am northbound (Campbelltown) service will be diverted away from the Camden CBD as there will be no access through the area for this period.
- + The bus stops on Elizabeth Street (near Larkin Place), John Street (near Argyle Street) and Argyle Street (near Elizabeth Street) will not be in use from 8.30am to 12.00pm on the event day. A temporary bus stop will be implemented on John Street North (near Mitchell Street, outside the church) for southbound services. Northbound services maybe accessed at the existing bus stops on Oxley Street or Mitchell Street (near John Street, outside the school). See map below showing locations.

All other services around Camden will remain unaffected. The bus service provider (Busabout) will liaise with Transport for NSW to advise public transport users via their websites and apps. Advice will also be provided on the event page on Council's website and social media platforms.

5.4.2. TAXIS AND RIDE-SHARE PROVIDERS

Taxis and ride-share providers will continue to have access to the road network around the closures as per other road users.

5.5. CHANGES TO CYCLE ROUTES

The closure of Cawdor Road, Mitchell Street and Argyle Streets will not affect designated cycling routes through Camden. Cyclists will still be able to dismount and walk their bikes through the event sites. All existing cycle routes will remain in place and operational around the event site.

5.6. PEDESTRIAN MANAGEMENT AND HOSTILE VEHICLE MITIGATION (HVM)

The closure of Cawdor Road, Mitchell Street, Elizabeth Street and Argyle Streets during the Dawn Service, march and Community Service is designed to provide a pedestrian-friendly area for the events to operate in and for pedestrians to participate.

At each of the road closure stages, hostile vehicle mitigation (HVM) barriers will be placed at each entry point as noted on the TCPs at the direction of Council staff to prevent access to the site by unauthorised vehicles. A driver for each vehicle will always be present in case the vehicle needs to be moved to allow access for emergency vehicles.

5.7. RE-OPENING ROADS AFTER THE EVENT

The road closure on Cawdor Road and adjacent parking at Onslow Oval for the Dawn Service is planned to re-open at 7.00am however this may occur earlier if the road is clear and it is safe to do so.

The road closures on Mitchell Street, Elizabeth Street and Argyle Street for the march and Cawdor Road for the Community Service are currently planned to be re-opened at 12.00pm. However, if in the opinion of the Event Organiser and traffic controllers on duty, the closure is no longer required for event bump-out purposes, the roads may be opened earlier to traffic movements.

Note that while at least one lane each way will be re-opened along Argyle Street at 12.00pm, a lane each way will still remain closed through until 2.00pm to facilitate the safe removal of fencing from the roadway. Again, these lanes will be partially or fully re-opened earlier if the Event Organiser and traffic controllers agree it is safe to do so.

It is expected that all roads will be operating as normal by 2.00pm.



6. MINIMISING IMPACT ON THE NON-EVENT COMMUNITY

6.1. ACCESS FOR LOCAL RESIDENTS AND BUSINESSES

The road closure area for ANZAC Day includes many businesses and some residential buildings fronting Cawdor Road, Argyle Street, Elizabeth and Mitchell Streets as well as some sections of John, Murray, Oxley and Hill Streets. Access to these businesses and residences will be maintained as much as possible.

Traffic controllers will allow emergency access only to the Elizabeth and Mitchell Street closures for residents, business operators and emergency vehicles at walking pace only. Access will not be permitted into these areas for business customers. No other vehicle movements (other than emergency vehicles or those associated with the parade) will be permitted into, within or out of the event site.

Vehicle access will be maintained for the Caltex service station at the corner of Cawdor Road and Barsden Street. A contra-flow arrangement will also be put in place at the roundabout at the corner of Mitchell and Elizabeth Streets to facilitate southbound traffic on Elizabeth Street turning right onto Mitchell Street and eastbound traffic on Mitchell Street turning left onto Elizabeth Street. The eastern and southern sides of the roundabout will remain closed to normal traffic to allow safe movement of parade participants and vehicles between the Mitchell Street and Elizabeth Street marshalling areas.

Pedestrian access to all businesses and residential properties will not be impacted by the event or road closures other than the prevention of pedestrians crossing Argyle Street during the march and the increased foot traffic expected to be generated as a result of the events.

The Event Organiser will notify all residents and businesses impacted by the event including confirmation of the restricted vehicle movements during the event operating times. This will include reviewing any requirements for changes to commercial waste collection times and/or locations.

6.2. ACCESS FOR EMERGENCY VEHICLES

Emergency service vehicles will have unobstructed access into the event site if required via any of the normal road entry points. While HVM measures will be in place, a driver for



all vehicles will always be present in case the vehicle needs to be moved to allow access for emergency vehicles.

6.3. ADVERTISING TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT ARRANGEMENTS

The Event Organiser will advertise the road closures in local print media, social media and on Council's website. A letterbox drop will be conducted to all resident and businesses in the immediately vicinity of the event sites and road closures as well as the surrounding streets in Camden. VMS will also be placed on approach roads to the Camden CBD (see below) to alert road users.

6.4. EVENT PROMOTION

The Event Organiser will promote ANZAC Day in Camden and the road closures taking place using a variety of methods in the weeks preceding the event including:

- + Camden Council's social media platforms
- + Camden Council's website
- + Camden RSL Sub-Branch's website
- + Camden RSL Sub-Branch's social media platforms

6.5. VARIABLE MESSAGE SIGNS

Three Variable Message Signs (VMS) will be used on approach roads to the event location to advice road users of the event and changes taking place to the road network. These will be placed as follows:

- + Western side of Cawdor Road before Barsden Street
- + Western side of Old Hume Highway before Menangle Road
- + Southern side of Camden Valley Way after Wilkinson Street

The VMS boards will be installed on Monday 18 April 2022 and will read as follows:

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To document concurrence previously provided by Local Traffic Committee through an Electronic Meeting for Ingleburn Road, Leppington - Signage, Line-marking and Devices Associated with Subdivision No. 108 & 116.

MAIN REPORT

Signage and line-marking plans have been received by Council for the construction of the Woolworths Supermarket at 108 & 116 Ingleburn Road, Leppington. The Location is highlighted on **Attachment 1**. This relates to the Development Application number: DA/2020/211/1.

The Engineering Drawing No. 19162_CC_C605, Rev.6, 19162_CC_C606, Rev.6, 19162_CC_C607, Rev.6, and 19162_CC_C608, Rev.6 prepared by Henry & Hymas Consulting provide details of the proposed signage and line-marking (**Attachment 2**). The plans are considered to be in accordance with Austroads, Australian Standards and TfNSW supplements for the placement of regulatory signage and line-marking.




