The much-loved Macarthur Lions Street Parade attracted a crowd of about 2,000. A big thank you to the Macarthur Lions for another successful celebration, it was fantastic to see the community come together to reflect and respect.

Council also held its first Citizenship Ceremony for the year, which saw more than 90 residents pledge their commitment to our great country and become Australian citizens. Denise Pritchard took home the Camden Citizen of the Year Award. Ms. Pritchard has been a member of the Camden/Wollondilly Domestic Violence Committee for over 10 years, remaining proactive in its projects. She was also heavily involved in setting up Blue Wren House – Camden Women's Shelter, where she is on the board as its Chair.

Brydie Meredith, an inspiring teacher at Catherine Park Physie and Dance, was named Young Citizen of the Year. Brydie teaches five classes, three days a week, all in her own time, and supports club members who have social, intellectual and behavioural needs.

Beverley Batros and Garry Clarke both took home the Sports Achievement Award. Ms. Batros has been a member of the netball club, Benkennie, since its inception in 1984. Ms. Batros began at the club as a player before she coached for 16 years, offering countless hours of her time to develop the club's rising stars. Mr. Clarke is a member of the Eventing Equestriad Committee, where he volunteers as the club treasurer to help ensure the events held at the Camden Bicentennial Equestrian Park are always a success.



The Camden West Rural Fire Station won the Community Group Award. The Brigade has made significant contributions to the local community through their tireless efforts as a team of volunteers that respond to bushfires, structure fires, alarms, car accidents, back burning and fire preparation, storms, floods, searches, calls for assistance and more. They have an unwavering dedication to Camden and its surrounds responding to emergencies 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

Taking out the Arts and Cultural Award was local artist, Patricia Johnson. Ms. Johnson has inspired and mentored many artists in our community and I'd like to thank her for dedicating so much time to sharing her talent and enriching our local arts scene.
