Camden Get There Bus It

The Camden Get There Bus It service is a free Friday late night transport service for young people that live in the Camden LGA. The service has been operating since August last year, and is targeted towards 18-25 year olds.

The aim of the service is to get young adults home safely from entertainment places that serve alcohol. The service was an initiative from Camden Council and received one-off funding from the Department of Community Services (DoCS) through the Macarthur Area Assistance Scheme (MACAAS).

Unfortunately funding is about to stop which means this free service can no longer be provided. The last night the service will operate is Friday 2 October 2009.

Magpies Swooping



Magpies are characteristic of the Australian urban environment and their social behaviour and distinctive song provide enjoyment for many people.

Magpie pairs breed in Spring and with this comes the magpies' natural behaviour to defend the territory around their nesting site. This may result in magpies swooping either people or pets who they perceive as a threat to their nest.

Magpies are protected throughout NSW, and it is against the law to kill the birds, collect their eggs, or harm their young. If you feel a magpie is a serious menace, report it to The National Parks Centre on 1300 361 967.

People can take the following precautions during the period when birds are actively protecting their territory.

- Do not deliberately provoke or harass the birds as this may make them more aggressive.

- Take care as injuries can occur as a result of the birds striking.
- Walk out of the bird's territory immediately.
- Avoid the swooping area by taking an alternative route.
- Wear a large, wide brim hat and sunglasses or carry an open umbrella; you can place eyes on the back of hats and umbrellas which may reduce the likelihood of the birds swooping.
- Keep an eye on the bird as this may discourage attack.
- Make a temporary sign to warn others.

Bike Riders

- If possible take an alternative route.
- Get off your bike and walk through the bird's territory.
- Wear a helmet and sunglasses.
- Fit a bike flag to your bike.

National Tree Day 2009

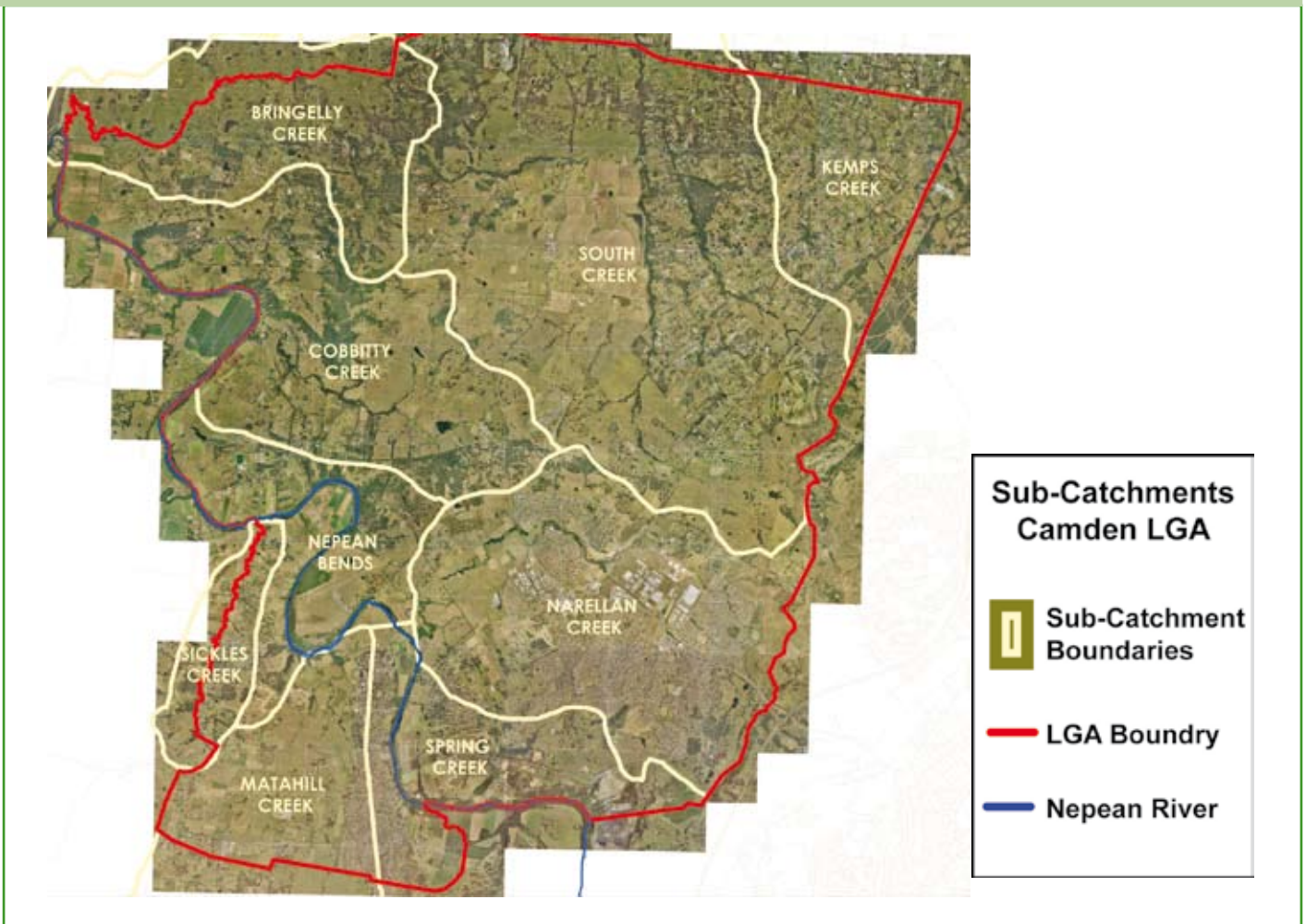
Additionally these trees will absorb approximately 220 tonnes of carbon dioxide annually. In terms of Council's "Carbon Footprint" this equates to offsetting the carbon emissions generated by a fleet of 20 Holden Commodores travelling 35,000 Kilometers per year.

Where Do You Live in the Catchment?



Camden Local Government Area (LGA) lies largely within the Nepean River Sub-catchment located downstream of the Upper Nepean Sub-catchment which contains significant dams and protected water supply catchments. The Nepean River joins the Hawkesbury River Catchment at its confluence with the Grose River near Agnes Banks, together forming what is known as the Hawkesbury-Nepean Catchment.

A catchment is an area of land bounded by hills or mountain range, from which all runoff water eventually collects at the lowest point such as a creek, river, lake or ocean.

Larger catchments consisting of a vast network of creeks and rivers are made up of sub-catchments bounded by lower hills and ridges that drain into smaller creeks or gullies. *Using the aerial map see if you can find where you live in the catchment.*

In an urbanised catchment rain runs off hard surfaces such as roofs, driveways and roads and ends up in the Nepean River through a system of street gutters, drains and stormwater pipes. Along the way, this stormwater collects pollutants such as litter,

dirt, oil and nutrients which have contributed to dangerous outbreaks of blue-green algae and aquatic weeds in our beautiful lakes and waterways.

If we want healthier waterways then we all need to do something about it. You can help by:

- Not overusing fertilisers and chemicals on the lawn and garden.
- Considering natural alternatives to pest control chemicals.

Catchments are also referred to as a catchment area; drainage, river or water basin; or a watershed.

125 cubic metres of cans, plastic bottles and bags, leaf litter and silt was removed from the Harrington Park, Mount Annan and Currans Hill areas during the last twelve months - That's about thirteen skip bins full of rubbish prevented from flowing into the Nepean River!!

- Using a broom to sweep driveways and gutters and place the sweepings in the compost or bin.
- Raking up leaves or lawn clippings and using them as mulch on the garden.
- Preventing soil, mulch and dog waste from being washed or blown into the gutter.
- Grassing or re-planting areas of disturbed soil.
- Not pouring used paints, solvents or any chemicals down the drain.

Council is also doing its bit for improving stormwater quality. With funding from the Stormwater Management Levy, Council has been busy with the following projects:

- Completion of the Stormwater Harvesting System at Harrington Park – contributing to 90% of the

water demand (the equivalent of 38 Olympic swimming pools) for irrigation of the 3.7ha soccer fields and reserves in Harrington Park.

- Operation of the Lake Annan Aeration System for the ongoing improvement of water quality.
- Prioritised maintenance of stormwater treatment devices and development of detailed designs for a suite of new stormwater outlet controls in Camden, Camden South and Elderslie.
- Further drain stenciling as part of a stormwater education campaign with the message “*This pit drains to the Nepean River*”.
- Water quality monitoring to determine the success of stormwater improvement initiatives.

- Additional maintenance of Gross Pollutant Traps (GPTs) to help prevent litter and pollutants entering local creeks and river.

- Maintenance of constructed wetlands including the removal of silt at the Cascades pond system at Mount Annan.

- Development of a comprehensive Asset Management Plan to identify and prioritise construction and maintenance of stormwater assets.

Kerbside Cleanup



Each residential property is entitled to two free Kerbside Cleanups per financial year. Would you like to arrange a Kerbside Cleanup?

Please follow these important steps:

Step 1: Phone 4654 7777 to arrange a collection day. Do not put your material on the kerbside until you have made a booking with Council.

Step 2: Once you know what day your collection will be, you can put

your material out no earlier than 48 hours (2 days) before the collection date. This will keep our streets safe and tidy.

Step 3: Get the volume right. Only 3 cubic metres of material in total will be accepted from each property (3m x 1m x 1m).

Step 4: Separate the general waste, metals and green waste into three piles.

Lighting of Birriwa Reserve Car Park

The lights to the car park have been installed by Integral Energy under their night watch lighting service agreement. The installation consists of floodlights mounted to existing streetlights in Fitzpatrick Street and aimed towards the car park adjacent to the amenities building.

Reconstruction Work

Recent road projects completed were the southern part of Little Street (from Little Byrne Street to the end) where new road pavement and kerb and gutter were constructed. The construction teams are currently working in Cobbitty Road, between Teen Ranch and the school. There will be another section of Cobbitty Road done straight after this one.

Camden Main Street Centre Median Upgrade



Council proposed to commence works on the Camden Main Street Centre Median Upgrade project in June 2009. The centre median upgrade is the first of a number projects identified in the Camden Town Strategy designed to revitalise the Camden Town Centre.

This project primarily aims to provide an immediate improvement to the aesthetics of the main street of Camden.

The work to be carried out in the centre median includes removal of

existing turf, remediation of the soil, extensive planting of hedging and perennial plants with floral annual beds, provision of a new irrigation system and the installation of up lighting to highlight the trees to provide a feature at night.

During the construction works of approximately four weeks there will be some disruption to traffic and pedestrians crossing the main street to allow the works to be carried out safely.

Narellan Urban Forest Playground and Stage 2 works

The contract for the construction of the Narellan Urban Forest Playground was awarded by Council on 14 April 2009 to Furnass Landscaping Enterprises.

Works will commence on 13 May 2009 and are due to be completed by mid August 2009. The works in Stage 2

of the Narellan Urban Forest project include the installation of a pedestrian bridge and boardwalk over the drainage channel with additional pathways. It is expected that the bridge, boardwalk and path construction will be completed in July 2009.



New Annual Multicultural Street Festival To Be Held In Narellan

Council has received funds from the Community Relations Commission to facilitate street festivals in Narellan every October 2009 - 2011.

The festival will be developed and implemented by Council staff, a voluntary working party of local residents and TAFE students. It will be held in the area between Narellan Library and Narellan Town Centre and will include performances, dance, art/craft activities and food stalls. exploring the stars and the continuing evolution of the sciences.

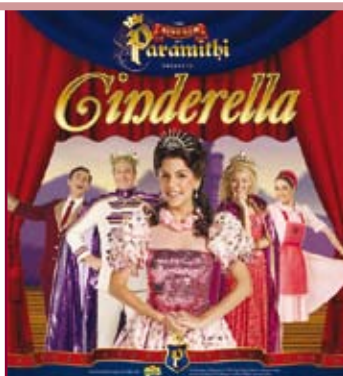
