Local Traffic Committee

Background

Transport for NSW (TfNSW) is legislated as the Authority responsible for the control of traffic on all NSW Roads. In order to deal with the large number and range of traffic related matters, TfNSW has delegated certain aspects of the control of traffic on local roads to Council (under the Transport Administration Act 1988). To exercise this delegation, Councils must establish a Local Traffic Committee (LTC) and obtain the advice of the TfNSW and NSW Police.

Role of the Committee

The LTC is primarily a technical review and advisory committee which considers the technical merits of proposals and ensures that current technical guidelines are considered. It provides recommendations to Council on traffic and parking control matters and the provision of traffic control facilities and prescribed traffic control devices for which Council has delegated authority. The Committee also advises on traffic matters arising from development applications (regulatory signage and line marking only), special events and road safety issues.

Committee Delegations

The LTC has no decision-making powers. Council must refer all traffic related matters to the Local Traffic Committee prior to exercising its delegated functions. Matters related to State Roads or functions that have not been delegated to Council must be referred directly to the TfNSW or relevant organisation.

The Committee provides recommendations to Council. Council is not bound by the advice of its LTC. Council can choose not to proceed with a recommendation of the Local Traffic Committee by not endorsing it at a Council Meeting where the minutes are presented.

Should Council wish to act contrary to the advice of the Committee or if that advice is not supported unanimously by the Committee members, Council must write to both the TfNSW and NSW Police, who may then choose to appeal to the Regional Traffic Committee within 14 days.

Committee Membership

The LTC is made up of four formal voting members. The members are as follows:

- one representative of Council as nominated by Council;
- one representative of the NSW Police from each Local Area Command (LAC) within the LGA;
- one representative from the TfNSW; and
- the local State Member(s) of Parliament (MP) or their nominee.

Where the Council area is represented by more than one MP or covered by more than one Police LAC, representatives are only permitted to vote on matters within their electorate or LAC.



The role of the four voting members is to:

- review the information provided to the committee.
- advise whether or not the technical justification of facilities meet the relevant guidelines and standards (facilities include lines, signs and devices).
- ensure that the recommendations conform to the matters being referred to and should be recommended for Council to endorse.

In relation to this:

- I. The council representatives and Local Members of Parliament (or representative) typically consider the interests of Council and its constituents. Both representatives on the Committee provide valued local knowledge.
- II. The Transport for NSW (TfNSW) representative provides advice on compliance of the matters with regards to various standards and guidelines.
- III. The NSW Police representative provides input on implications for the road network, particularly where a proposal may affect road safety.

The Committee may also have additional informal (non-voting) advisors. These may include:

- Council Officers
- Chamber of Commerce representatives
- Bus Operator representatives
- Other representatives as determined from time to time.

The informal advisors are not required to attend every LTC meeting. Their attendance is only necessary when items appear on the Agenda which affect their area of expertise or responsibility. The informal advisors are not entitled to a vote.

Please note there is no public gallery for these meetings.

LTC Business Paper

Council is responsible for preparing an LTC agenda and circulates to all formal members and informal advisors of the committee approximately one week prior to the meeting. This will allow members to fully consider the issues and determine their response on each item.

Council encourages each member of the LTC to undertake a site visit prior to considering any proposal. Site visits may be undertaken individually or organised with Council's Traffic Engineer(s).

SUBJECT: LADY JOSEPHINE GRANGE, GLEDSWOOD HILLS - INSTALLATION

OF NEW BUS STOPS

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence for the installation of bus stops on Lady Josephine Grange.

BACKGROUND

The bus operator has requested bus stops on both sides of Lady Josephine Grange adjacent to a side boundary of No. 19.

MAIN REPORT

Lady Josephine Grange is a local road in Gledswood Hills, running between Providence Drive and Camden Valley Way, with indented parking along the western side. The 899 bus service, operating between Camden and Catherine Field, currently travels along this road, with existing bus stops already in place at some locations.

The bus operator has requested the installation of additional bus stops on both sides of Lady Josephine Grange, adjacent to the side boundary of No. 19, as shown in **Attachment 1**. This request follows reports that bus drivers have been informally picking up and dropping off passengers at this location.

There is vegetated buffer zone and grade difference between the road and residential properties, minimising any impact.

FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

The estimated cost of the recommended work is \$3,000 incorporating concreting and tactile indicators. It is proposed that the cost be funded from the TfNSW Block Grant (Traffic Facilities Component) for the 2025/26 financial year.

CONCLUSION

A request has been received from the bus operator for new bus stops on Lady Josephine Grange. It is recommended that this request be supported.



RECOMMENDED

The Local Traffic Committee recommends that Council approve in Lady Josephine Grange, Gledswood Hills, bus stops on both sides of the road adjacent to the side boundary of No. 19.

SUBJECT: BAGNALL STREET, GREGORY HILLS - GIVE WAY TREATMENT AT

INTERSECTION WITH ENTERPRISE STREET

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence for give way treatment and associate double lines at the intersection of Bagnall Street with Enterprise Street.

BACKGROUND

The intersection of Bagnall Street with Enterprise Street forms part of a four-leg intersection with Explorer Street and Enterprise Street. There is an existing give way treatment on the eastern side of the intersection along Enterprise Street. A give way Treatment on the western side of the intersection is proposed to address safety concerns.

MAIN REPORT

Bagnall Street is a 7.8-metre-wide local road in Gregory Hills which intersects with Enterprise Street, forming a four-leg intersection. See **Attachment 1.**

Concern has been raised regarding motorist confusion at the intersection. It is proposed that a give way treatment with associated double barrier line marking is installed to address the issue and ensure conformity and compliance (see **Attachment 2**). The double line marking will reinforce Road Rule restricting parking within 10 metres of an intersection.

Consultation was undertaken with adjacent owners and occupiers. No responses were received.

FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

It is proposed that the cost of the installation be funded from the TfNSW Block Grant (Traffic Facilities component) for the 2024/25 financial year at an approximate cost of \$700.

CONCLUSION

Following concerns about motorist confusion and lack of conformity, it is recommended that the committee supports the installation of a Give Way treatment at the intersection of Bagnall Street with Enterprise Street.


RECOMMENDED

The Local Traffic Committee recommends that Council approve in Bagnall Street, Gregory Hills, at the western intersection with Enterprise Street:

- i. Give Way signage (R1-2) and line marking (TB/TB1); and
- ii. 10 metres of double barrier (BB) centre line.

SUBJECT: WEBBER LOOP, ORAN PARK - NO STOPPING RESTRICTIONS AND

CENTRE LINES AT ORAN PARK DRIVE

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence for the installation of No Stopping restrictions and centre line-marking at Webber Loop, Oran Park.

BACKGROUND

Concerns have been raised regarding parked vehicles blocking access to Webber Loop from Oran Park Drive. Line-marking and signage is proposed to address the issue.

MAIN REPORT

Webber Loop is a 9.6metre-wide local road in Oran Park with direct access to Oran Park Drive (see **Attachment 1**). The road narrows towards the intersection with kerb extension on both sides. Previously vacant adjacent land is now planned for development.

To help address concerns about future parked vehicles in the narrow section of Webber Loop near Oran Park Drive, it is proposed to install No Stopping signage along this section. It is proposed to supplement this with a short length of double barrier centre linemarking to assist delineation at the intersection (see **Attachment 2**).

There are currently no adjacent properties to consult.

FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

The estimated cost of the recommended work is \$2,000. It is proposed that the cost be funded from the TfNSW Block Grant (Traffic Facilities Component) for the 2025/26 financial year.

CONCLUSION

Concerns have been raised regarding future parking on Webber Loop blocking access from Oran Park Drive, and it is recommended that the Committee supports line marking and signage to help address the issue.

The Local Traffic Committee recommends that Council approve in Webber Loop, Oran Park, from Oran Park Drive:

- i. No Stopping restrictions (R5-400 signs) for 20 metres on the southern side;
- ii. No Stopping restrictions (R5-400 signs) for 60 metres on the northern side and
- iii. 16 metres of double barrier (BB) centre line-marking.



SUBJECT: BARSDEN STREET, CAMDEN - KERB EXTENSIONS AT CAMDEN

APEX PARK

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence for the installation of kerb extensions with pram ramps on Barsden Street, at Camden Apex Park.

BACKGROUND

Council has developed a Pedestrian Access and Mobility Plan which has identified a list of potential new footpaths with the priority being collector roads, town centres and missing links, being working through year-by-year. A gap in the network has been identified on Barsden Street at Camden Apex Park, with the crossing point with kerb extensions being the subject of this report.

MAIN REPORT

Barsden Street is 10.5-metre-wide collector road in Camden with Camden Apex Park and a Scout Hall on the southern side at the western end. An Overview Plan is shown in **Attachment 1**.

Pedestrian Access and Mobility Plan which has identified a missing footpath link to Camden Apex Park and crossing point in Barsden Street, reflecting community concerns. A design has been completed for a path and kerb extensions with pram ramps and associated signage (see **Attachment 2**). Last year Council engaged Endeavour Energy to install an additional streetlight at this location.

Consultation has been undertaken with adjacent owners and occupiers and one response has been received in support of the proposal.

FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

The works are by funded Council and Western Sydney Infrastructure Grants Program from the adopted Pedestrian Access and Mobility Plan budget.

CONCLUSION

Concerns have been raised about the lack of footpath and crossing point on Barsden Street and it is recommended that the Committee supports the kerb extensions at Camden Apex Park.

RECOMMENDED

The Local Traffic Committee recommends that Council approves in Barsden Street, Camden, kerb extensions at Camden Apex Park as detailed in Drawing No. P-101771 C006/07.



SUBJECT: MACARTHUR ROAD, SPRING FARM - UPDATED SIGNAGE, LINE-

MARKING AND DEVICES ASSOCIATED WITH THE ROAD UPGRADE

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence for the signs, line-marking and devices associated with the upgrade of Macarthur Road, Spring Farm.

BACKGROUND

Council has identified the upgrades of a section of Macarthur Road from the Camden Bypass to intersection with Springs Road as part of the development planning of the Spring Farm precinct. The upgrades will facilitate new residential development supported by signage, line-marking and traffic devices which are the subject of this report.

MAIN REPORT

Macarthur Road in Spring Farm connects to the Camden Bypass at the interchange, providing a connection between Camden and Narellan, and under Camden Bypass to Elderslie.

Macarthur Road is a collector road running into Springs Road and currently has a median island in the vicinity of Camden Bypass with a gravel median for approximately 100 metres towards Springs Road. Macarthur Road is signposted at 60 km/h and Springs Road at 50km/h. **Attachment 1** shows an aerial view of the area.

The precinct planning for Spring Farm has identified upgrade for Macarthur Road between the Camden Bypass interchange and Springs Road to facilitate the growth of Spring Farm precinct. Plans were approved by the Local Traffic Committee in December 2023. However, the kerbs and median island have since been amended due to unknown utility services. Further, Transport for NSW has concurred with the reduction of the slip lane on Macarthur Road. Works on the slip lane from Camden Bypass are part of the State Road network and are subject to separate approval from TfNSW.

Features of the upgrade project (see Attachment 2) include:

- Amended and extended concrete median along Macarthur Road.
- Traffic islands at the slip road from Camden Bypass bringing forward the Give Way control to improve sight lines.
- A new roundabout at the intersection of Macarthur Road and Springs Road; and
- An extension of the existing shared path on Macarthur Road to Springs Road.

With this urban upgrade changing the road environment, Council is requesting that TfNSW review the existing 60km/h speed limit on Macarthur Road in Spring Farm, acknowledging this is not within the delegation of Council or the Local Traffic Committee.

FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

The Upgrade is funded by the precinct Development Contributions Plan.

CONCLUSION


Council has identified Macarthur Road for upgrade as part of the precinct planning in the Spring Farm area. The upgrade will facilitate new residential development and community facilities. It is recommended that the Committee supports the associated signage line-marking and traffic devices.

RECOMMENDED

The Local Traffic Committee recommends that Council approve in Macarthur Road, Spring Farm, signage, line-marking and devices as detailed in Plan No. 319118 Sheets C503, C504 and C505 Rev. H, subject to works on the Camden Bypass slip lane being subject to separate approval from Transport for NSW.




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


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SUBJECT: KIMBARRA AVENUE, CAMDEN - CENTRE LINE AT CURVE

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence for double barrier lines at the curve on Kimbarra Avenue, Camden.

BACKGROUND

Concerns have been raised regarding vehicles not keeping left along the curve on Kimbarra Avenue, Camden, creating concern for oncoming vehicles. Line marking is proposed to address this.

MAIN REPORT

Kimbarra Avenue is local access road in Camden with varying widths from 11 to 13 metres. There is a 90-degree compound curve at the northern end (see **Attachment 1**).

Concerns have been raised about the lack of delineation around the curve and is proposed to install double barrier (BB) line to help ensure vehicles keep left (see **Attachment 2**).

Because of the generous road width, the proposed treatment would not have any impact on on-street parking. Right turning into and out of driveways will still be permissible, in accordance with the road rules.

Owners and occupiers adjacent to the proposal have been consulted. No responses were received.

FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

It is proposed that the cost of the line marking will be funded from the TfNSW Block Grant (Traffic Facilities component) for the 2025/26 financial year at an approximate cost of \$1,000.

CONCLUSION

To address concerns regarding motorists not travelling around the curve on Kimbarra Avenue safely, it is recommended that the Committee supports double barrier lines.

RECOMMENDED

The Local Traffic Committee recommends that Council approve in Kimbarra Avenue, Camden, 45 metres of double barrier (BB) lines around the curve.

SUBJECT: RICKARD ROAD, LEPPINGTON - TIMED PARKING RESTRICTIONS AT

LEPPINGTON PUBLIC SCHOOL

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence for the implementation of timed parking restrictions in the vicinity of Leppington Public School.

BACKGROUND

To assist in improving drop off and pick up facilities for the school, it is proposed to implement 30-minute parking restrictions along the eastern side of Rickard Road and extending the existing 2-hour parking restrictions along the western side of Rickard Road during school zone times.

MAIN REPORT

Rickard Road in Leppington is a two-lane rural collector road with unsealed shoulders along most of its length (see **Attachment 1**). Leppington Public School currently has existing drop off and pick up facilities along its frontage. North of the school frontage is currently unrestricted parking which is regularly occupied by commuter parking. Extensive queuing has been observed along Rickard Road, impacting on traffic flow during school zone times.

To assist in managing the facilities and improve traffic flow along Rickard Road, it is proposed to provide 120 metres of timed ½ hour parking (8am-9:30am, 2:30pm-4pm School Days) (R5-16 signage) restrictions along the eastern side of Rickard Road, north of Leppington Public School. No Stopping (R5-400 signage) restrictions are also proposed across driveways to deter queuing across driveways. It is also proposed to extend the existing 2 hour timed (8am-9:30am, 2:30pm-4pm School Days) (R5-2 signage) restrictions along the western side of Rickard Road, opposite the school, 45 metres to the north (see **Attachment 2**).

Consultation was undertaken with affected owners and occupiers no responses were received. The School has advised that they support the proposal.

FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

It is proposed that the cost of the signage installation be funded from the TfNSW Block Grant (Traffic Facilities component) for the 2024/25 financial year at an approximate cost of \$3,500.

CONCLUSION

Concern has been raised regarding drop-off and pick-up facilities to service Leppington Public School and it is proposed to extend and implement timed parking restrictions along Rickard Road.


The Local Traffic Committee recommends that Council approve in Rickard Road, Leppington:

- i. Half hour (8am-9:30am; 2:30pm-4pm School Days) R5-16 signage along the eastern side for 120 metres northwards of the Bus Zone.
- ii. No Stopping (R5-400 signage) 5 metres to each approach of the driveways on the eastern side; and
- iii. Extension of existing 2-hour (8am-9:30am; 2:30pm-4pm School Days) (R5-2 signage) restrictions on the western side by 45 metres northwards.

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SUBJECT: SMEATON GRANGE ROAD, SMEATON GRANGE - EXTENSION OF

BUS ZONE AND NO STOPPING RESTRICTION AT MAGDALENE

CATHOLIC COLLEGE

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence for extending the bus zone and No Stopping restrictions on Smeaton Grange Road near Magdalene Catholic College.

BACKGROUND

Magdalene Catholic College has requested an extension of the Bus Zone on Smeaton Grange Road to accommodate overflow of buses. Concern has also been raised along about queuing into the school access, resulting from a build-up of vehicles wishing to continue along the road.

MAIN REPORT

Smeaton Grange Road is an industrial road in Smeaton Grange which measures 11.2 metres wide. There is a privately owned bus service road for Magdalene Catholic College and Council has previously extended the Bus Zone along Smeaton Grange Road on the approach to this service road (see **Attachment 1**).

The school has requested an extension to the Bus Zone on the public road to accommodate additional school bus demand. It is proposed to extend the timed Bus Zone (2pm-3pm School Days) (R5-20 signage) on the northeast side by 15 metres to accommodate an additional bus.

Council also received correspondence regarding traffic build up. This is because through traffic is unable to pass vehicles waiting to turn right into Magdalene Catholic College due to parked vehicles along the kerb side. To address the matter, it is proposed to extend the existing No Stopping (R5-400 signage) restrictions on the southwestern side by 20 metres (see **Attachment 2**).

Consultation has been undertaken with adjacent owners and occupiers. No responses were received.

FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

It is proposed that the cost of the signage be funded from the TfNSW Block Grant (Traffic Facilities component) for the 2024/25 financial year at an approximate cost of \$500.

CONCLUSION



Following requests from the school and motorists, it is proposed to extend the Bus Zone on Smeaton Grange Road to accommodate additional buses and extend the No Stopping restriction to accommodate turning vehicles.

RECOMMENDED


The Local Traffic Committee recommends that Council approve in Smeaton Grange Road, Smeaton Grange:

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To seek Local Traffic Committee concurrence for signage and line marking associated with the implementation of a children's crossing in Farifax Reserve near the entry to Harrington Park Public School.

BACKGROUND

Council has received concerns regarding pedestrian safety through the Fairfax Reserve Car Park as pedestrians seek to access the Harrington Park Public School. An interim children's crossing is proposed to help address the issues.

MAIN REPORT

Fairfax Reserve has a cricket / AFL field serviced by a public car park adjacent to Harrington Park Public School. The school has access to a private staff car park via right of way through the reserve. The sports field car park is utilised for school drop off and pick up (see **Attachment 1**).

A major redevelopment and expansion of the school was undertaken from 2020 to 2022. Through the redevelopment, a replacement staff car park and vehicle access were provided, facilitated by Council though an extension of the right of way. The old vehicle access at a roundabout in the reserve was made redundant. Schools Infrastructure NSW therefore provided some replacement kerb, footpaths, line-marking and road flaps but did not have funding available to reconfigure the roadway and crossing point.

Council has therefore scoped a project to provide a raised crossing incorporating removal of the roundabout. It would also allow provision of some additional parking spaces. However, this project is currently unfunded, and Council is exploring external funding opportunities.

In the meantime, concerns have been raised about the safety of crossing at the existing pram ramps. An interim children's crossing is therefore proposed with associated signage and line-marking (see **Attachment 2**).

FINANCIAL AND ASSET MANAGEMENT IMPLICATIONS

The signage, line-marking and pram ramp works are estimated to cost \$15,000. It is proposed that the cost be funded from the TfNSW Block Grant (Traffic Facilities Component) for the 2025/26 financial year.



CONCLUSION

The provision of an interim children's crossing will enhance pedestrian safety through the Fairfax Reserve car park, and it is recommended that the Committee supports the proposal.







3.2 Parking

The following changes to parking availability and conditions will be made in the Camden CBD:

3.2.1 Temporary Parking Removal

- + Approximately 60m of 45-degree angled parking on the west side of John Street (between Argyle Street and Larkin Place) will be closed to provide storage of fencing equipment and fencing vehicles during bump-in, the events and bump-out.
- + Approximately 40m of 45-degree angled parking on the east side of John Street (just north of Mitchell Street) will be closed to provide a temporary bus stop for southbound buses from 8.30am to 12.00 on event the day.

CATO will erect no-parking/clearway signage in these areas in advance of 25th April 2025 to prevent the public parking here during these times.

3.2.2 Changes to On-Street Parking Conditions

CATO will erect no-parking/clearway signage along the following streets in advance of 25th April 2025:

- + Elizabeth Street (both sides) between Mitchell Street and Argyle Street.
- + Argyle Street (both sides) between Edward Street and Murray Street.
- + Cawdor Road (both sides) between Murray Street and Barsden Street.

Any vehicles still parked along these streets in the morning of the event will have a leaflet placed on them notifying the driver to contact event organisers to ensure their vehicle can be moved safely. Council have advised they may have a tow truck available on standby to relocate vehicles within the signposted clearway areas should it be required if the vehicle is impacting the safe operation of the event.

CATO will remove signage once the event is complete.

There is significant other parking in the streets surrounding the event site and parking is also available in dedicated car parks within the Camden town centre. Other than those noted above, access to almost all parking locations will be maintained through the majority of the day, even during the major closure period for the march.

3.3 Construction, Traffic Calming and Traffic Generating Developments

Access to traffic generating developments within the Camden CBD such as Coles & Woolworths, etc are maintained using alternate access points not within the closure points.

Road closures staged to reduce the hours where access along Argyle Street is fully closed.

3.5 Impact on / or Public Transport


ANZAC Day will be held in Camden on Friday 25th April, a public holiday. Local buses will operate on a public holiday timetable and will therefore be minimal on the event day with only one service running. The impact on public transport will be as follows:

3.5.1 Buses

The 895 is the only bus services operating through the Camden CBD on a public holiday. Its movements will be managed as follows:

- + From 8.30am all buses will be diverted around the Elizabeth Street closures via Edward, Exeter and John Streets, along with other traffic.
- + The final bus service permitted through Camden before the parade commences along Argyle Street will be the 10.20am northbound (Campbelltown) service.
- + The 10.57am southbound (Camden South) service and the 11.20am northbound (Campbelltown) service will be diverted away from the Camden CBD as there will be no access through the area for this period.
- + The bus stops on Elizabeth Street (near Larkin Place), John Street (near Argyle Street) and Argyle Street (near Elizabeth Street) will not be in use from 8.30am to 12.00pm on the event day. A temporary bus stop will be implemented on John Street North (near Mitchell Street, outside the church) for southbound services. Northbound services maybe accessed at the existing bus stops on Oxley Street or Mitchell Street (near John Street, outside the school). See map below showing locations.

All other services around Camden will remain unaffected. The bus service provider will liaise with Transport for NSW to advise public transport users via their websites and apps. Advice will also be provided on the event page on Council's website and social media platforms.

MAIN REPORT

The Camden Show Society has submitted a Traffic Guidance Scheme (TGS) outlining traffic management arrangements for the 2025 Camden Show. The plan includes pedestrian safety barriers and traffic control measures along Cawdor Road and Mitchell Street, Camden, similar to previous years. Additionally, the Show Society is proposing a street parade on Friday afternoon from 4:00 pm to 4:30 pm, which will require the temporary closure of part of John Street during that time.

The Camden Show is scheduled to take place on Friday, April 4, and Saturday, April 5, 2025, from 6:00 am to 11:30 pm. The annual event will be held at Onslow Park and the Bicentennial Equestrian Park, with an expected attendance of approximately 40,000 participants and visitors. Off-street parking for 1,300 vehicles has been allocated within the event site.

As in previous years, a fireworks display is planned for Saturday evening between 9:00 pm and 9:30 pm. To manage traffic during this time, the applicant has proposed the temporary closure of John Street between Mitchell Street and Exeter Street if long queues form. Marshals will be stationed at both ends of the closure to allow access to the school and church sites.

The parade will feature up to twelve vehicles, including some drawn by oxen or horses. The procession will be marshalled at the closed section of John Street before traveling south along John Street, west along Argyle Street to the Murray Street roundabout, then returning east along Argyle Street, turning left onto John Street, and heading north to conclude at the closed section.

As in previous years, it is proposed that the event be classified as a Class 2 event. The TGS outlined in Drawing No. 240029 (**Attachment 1**), have been prepared to minimize the impact on the road network. These plans are considered acceptable, and it is recommended that the committee support the submitted TGS.

 - J. Hostile vehicle mitigation plan to be approved by the NSW Police; and
 - K. The organisers securing any other necessary consents as advised by Council.
