

OUR CONNECTION

The Camden area has a long history of Aboriginal occupation and is located at the intersection of three tribal boundaries; the Gundungurra, Tharawal or Dharawal, and Dharug. The people of the Camden town location, the western Cowpastures and the adjoining mountainous areas were Gundungurra. The eastern Cowpastures were Tharawal, and the people to the northeast of the Nepean River were Dharug.

A meeting of local notables formed the municipality of Camden at a public meeting in 1883. In 1993, Camden Municipal became Camden Council.

OUR IDENTITY

During 2005, Council formally adopted the platypus (Djamalang) into its logo as a symbol of a Sustainable Camden because although once common in the area, the effect of human activities has impacted on the Nepean River and has seen the decline of the platypus. One of Council's goals is to improve the quality of the river so that the platypus can return to its natural habitat.

Campbelltown-based Aboriginal artist Michael Fardon holds a Bachelor of Visual Arts from the University of Western Sydney.

Michael is a proud Dharawal man and selftaught artist who lives and works on country in a wide range of styles and mediums including painting and digital formats.

Michael works closely with community and schools to create collaborative murals and other works of art with Indigenous students.

EDUCATION

- There are 18 public primary schools and five public high schools in the Camden LGA.
- In 2021, 24.3% of the Camden LGA was attending an educational institution. To break that down, 10.7% of the Camden LGA was in primary school, 7.3% in secondary school and 6.3% in tertiary education.
- Overall, 55.3% of people aged over 15 have completed Year 12 or equivalent. A total of 21.6% have completed a bachelor's degree or above.

HOUSEHOLD INCOME AND EXPENSES

In 2021, **32.1%** of households in the Camden LGA earned an income of \$3,000 or more per week.

The median weekly household income was \$2,353.

The median weekly rental payment was \$500.

The median weekly mortgage repayment was \$576.

VOLUNTEERING

In the Camden LGA, **9.1%** of residents have reported doing some form of voluntary work.

Camden Council has established advisory committees and reference groups to help guide Camden's future.

Council's advisory committees provide strategic or technical advice and may make recommendations to Council. Council's reference groups are actionoriented and often advise on the planning and delivery of projects or events.

Council has 170 volunteers within advisory committees, reference groups, libraries and in Council's Bushcare program.

Council continues to celebrate volunteers for their ongoing contributions to the Camden LGA. The Mayor hosts an annual Thank You Dinner for Council and community volunteers at the end of the year.

LONG TERM HEALTH CONDITIONS

Overall, **27.7%** of Camden's population has at least one Long Term Health Condition which is around the same average as the Greater Sydney average (**27.5%**).

The 3 major long term health conditions Camden's population suffers from are:

Asthma: **7.8%** Mental Health: **7.2%** Arthritis: **6.6%**

HOUSING

92% of the Camden LGA is made up of separated dwellings, compared to **53.4%** in Greater Sydney.

The average household size is 3.1 persons.

96.4% of private dwellings are occupied.


81.5% of households are made up of families with children.
