DRIVES FOR LEARNERS IN MACARTHUR – LOG BOOK RUN EVENTS

Frequently Asked Questions.

• What is the Log Book Run?

The Log Book Run is a joint program between Camden and Campbelltown Councils, and is designed to assist learner drivers gain hours in their log book, but also experience across a range of different road types.

Often learner drivers do the same drives, with everyone being time poor, so driving lessons are fitted in around familiar routes. The Log Book Run helps diversify their driving experience and take them on roads that they may not normally drive.

The Log Book Run takes in various road types, including suburban streets, rural roads, multi lane roads and freeway driving, across the Camden, Campbelltown and Wollondilly local government areas.

The program is also run in partnership with our Local Highway Patrol, who take part in the drive and attempt to pull over as many of the learner drivers as possible throughout the day for mobile or stationary RBT. This is to also give the learners this experience in a controlled environment, and gives Police the opportunity to provide the learner with positive feedback.

A driving instructor also attends on the day, not to give lessons, but to provide information and guidance to learners and their supervisors as required.

The event starts at Oran Park Library at 9am. Morning tea and lunch are provided, it is all free, and generally the day finishes by around 2pm.

- How many hours does it put towards my Log Book?
 2 ½ hrs
- How much does it cost? The event is FREE and morning tea and lunch are provided
- **Do l get the "3 for 1" hours for the drive?** No, the "3 for 1" offer is only through driving lessons with a driving instructor

- Do you provide the vehicle and supervisor? No, you must provide your own vehicle and supervising driver
- Is there a minimum number of hours my learner needs to have to take part? Yes, we ask that learner has a minimum of 25 hours in their log book
