As winter draws to a close for another year and we say hello to spring, we're taking a look back at the fabulous and frosty events held across Camden over the past few months.

Winterfest Camden took the area by snowstorm, taking place from Friday 7 to Sunday 9 July. The return of this frosty event was something we had waited a long time for, after COVID-19 forced the cancellation of the event in both 2020 and 2021 and the severe flooding events of 2022 cancelled last year's event.

All these false starts made it so much more special to see more than 7,000 people make their way down to Onslow Oval in Camden to enjoy the fun-filled winter themed activities and entertainment which took place at the winter wonderland.

Families from near and far enjoyed ice-skating and the ice slide; the mechanical snowboard and snow globe; activities for kids and the inclusive space; live entertainment and ice performances; and the incredible food and beverage stalls that turned up the flavour at the event.

SPECTACULAR EVENTS



On the same weekend, Mayor of Camden, Cr Ashleigh Cagney, attended two incredible sporting events. The first was the third and fourth round of the 2023 AusCycling BMX Racing National Series, hosted by Macarthur BMX Club on Saturday 8 and Sunday 9 July. The event featured more than 700 talented riders from every state and territory of Australia, as well as a number of riders from New Zealand.

Some of the country's top riders descended onto the Kirkham Park BMX Facility at Elderslie, including Queensland's Teya Rufus and Thomas Tucker, Victoria's Bella May and Max Carins and South Australia's Imogen Healy.

The second was the inaugural International Festival of Indigenous Football, co-hosted by Camden Tigers Indigenous Football Program and Maori Football Aotearoa at Ron Dine Reserve on Sunday 9 July. This event was a big celebration of the Indigenous cultures of both New Zealand and Australia through football, right as NAIDOC Week was drawing to a close.

The atmosphere was incredible, with an amazing welcome to country, smoking ceremonies and traditional dancing. The football games were preceded by the haka and Aboriginal war cry, which went a long way in showcasing the two cultures, so rich in history and storytelling.

WORK ACROSS CAMDEN



POPULAR WALKWAY COMES BACK TO LIFE

Council was excited to re-open the popular Miss Llewella Davies Pioneer Walkway at Camden Town Farm recently, following last year's damaging floods.

Council repaired and replaced parts of the pathway surface, reconstructed fences; removed flood debris; and replaced lost and damaged signage.

BRIDGES UPDATE

Last year's floods have significantly impacted a number of Camden's bridges.

We know these assets are vital in keeping our community moving in, out and around the Camden area smoothly, so we have been working to investigate the scale of damage, undertake repair works and reopen them as soon as possible.

LITTLE SANDY BRIDGE

Damage to the riverbank on the Elderslie side of Little Sandy Bridge worsened with each flooding event and Council has been working with specialist consultants to investigate and design suitable repair options, including possible improvements.

At time of writing (September 2023), Council has completed concept design options for the rectification of the damage to Little Sandy Bridge. A peer review of the options is being undertaken before detail design commences.

Further updates on timing will be provided once detailed design commences.

COWPASTURE BRIDGE

The pedestrian rail on Cowpasture Bridge was significantly damaged in the floods by displaced trees traveling down the river.

The damaged pedestrian rail was replaced last month, with no interruption to pedestrian or vehicle access.

WORK AT MOUNT ANNAN LEISURE CENTRE COMPLETE

LEARN TO SWIM

Improvements and remediation work to Mount Annan Leisure Centre (MALC) are now complete and the facility has re-opened to the public in full.

The \$1.75 million project was needed to address deteriorated roofing elements and repair work to corroded steel within the building.

Work included restoration work to the roof above the 25-metre and leisure pools as well as:

- Restoration of rusting structural steel members/purlins;
- Corroded structural column repairs;
- Replacement of water damaged plasterboard/bulkheads;
- Visual painting improvements;

DIVING

- Replacement of leaking/aged box gutters; and
- External roof flashing replacements/repairs.

AN ALPHA PLAYGROUND

The playground at Alpha Park in Camden has recently been upgraded.

The \$180,000 project has seen:

- A new swing set, including an inclusive two-seater nest;
- A new slide;
- An upgrade of the seating area; and
- Landscaping.



CAMDEN CIVIC CENTRE IS GETTING A MAKEOVER

Camden Civic Centre hosts a multitude of local, state and national events each year and is one of our most used facilities.

The venue is incredibly versatile and has served the community well for many years – but needs a facelift and improvements for improved community use.

The proposed upgrade works will create a new entry and foyer space; provide better connection from John Street to the Civic Centre; increase the amount of affordable multipurpose art making and community spaces available; create outdoor areas suitable for multi-purpose use; attract visitors to Camden; and so much more.

SUSTAINABLE LIVING



BANK STABILISATION PROJECT

Bank stabilisation works have been undertaken on the Nepean River at Ferguson's Land through a partnership project with Sydney Water.

The pilot project has included:

- Removal of woody weeds;
- Regrading of the bank;
- Installation of large woody debris structures to slow water flow and provide aquatic habitat; and
- Replanting local native vegetation.

The project, which is nearing completion, has successfully restored a section of the eroding bank of the Nepean River, preventing further erosion and soil loss which, in turn will prevent excess nutrients entering the River and degrading water quality.

RESTORING ELIZABETH MACARTHUR RESERVE

Camden Council teamed up with Sydney Water and Downer BMD Joint Venture to remove weeds and restore native vegetation along the creek line in Elizabeth Macarthur Reserve.

Approximately 3,000 native species from the River Flat Eucalypt Forest plant community, which is identified as a Critically Endangered Ecological Community, were planted in July and August, significantly improving the biodiversity value of the reserve.







WANT TO GET INVOLVED IN BUSHCARE?

A new Bushcare Group was launched at Camden Town Farm on Sunday 9 July. The launch event was a great success, with residents enjoying a guided walk and talk, bird spotting and even a mini beast hunt followed by a well-deserved morning tea.

We have a number of Bushcare groups looking for new volunteers, including Camden Town Farm, Harrington Forest, Kings Bush Reserve, Parrott Farm Reserve, Ron Dine Reserve, Sickles Creek Reserve and Spring Farm Bush Corridor.

Volunteers help manage and maintain the remnant urban bushland areas by controlling weeds, participating in revegetation, restoring bushlands, rivers and creeks and collecting seeds. All this while staying fit, meeting new people and making a difference to our local environment!

Immerse yourself in a multi-faceted cultural extravaganza that combines live performance, inspiring art, bustling markets and soul-stirring music.


