A COMMUNITY ART PROJECT FOR LITLLE SANDY BRIDGE

A community art project commissioned by Camden Council at Little Sandy Bridge is now complete and ready for the community and visitors to enjoy.

The striking artwork, which can be seen on the stairway leading up to Chellaston Reserve in Camden, was created by local Aboriginal artist Danielle Mate in collaboration with the Aboriginal community.

Inspired by the colours and design of the natural environment, the artwork celebrates flora and fauna of this popular site and pays tribute to Camden Council's mascot, the Platypus.

As part of the design process, Danielle consulted with the Aboriginal community and Mygunyah Camden Aboriginal Residents Group about place and connection and held art workshops to combine ideas in the creation of this vibrant artwork.
