Storm Event - 4 - 5 June 2016

"I am very pleased to say that in addition to managing our own needs, Camden Council was able to assist Wollondilly Council by providing equipment and staff to help with their clean-up efforts. On the Monday night following the storm, Council provided two 13 tonne tipper trucks, a rear loader waste truck and drivers to add to Wollondilly Council's clean-up crew. Our staff worked throughout the night assisting Wollondilly Council. The Mayor of Wollondilly personally called to thank me for Camden Council's assistance and I understand has also thanked Camden Council publically in media interviews following the event."
