Learner Log Book Run

Learner drivers can get more experience when the next round of the Drives for Learners in Macarthur - Log Book Run event is held on Sunday 17 June.

The log book run is designed to assist in obtaining the necessary log book hours, plus expose learner drivers to new experiences as a motorist, including vehicle checks, speed monitoring and breath testing.

"The log book run offers diverse driving experiences for learners and help them on their way to getting their license," said Mayor Lara Symkowiak.

"It's a great chance for our young drivers to try new routes, make contact with the police and learn more about how to be safer drivers," Cr Symkowiak said.

"Our local Highway Patrol do a great job in attending this event and working with our learner drivers, plus the event will give learners some really important hours in their log book."

Learner drivers who complete the day time Log Book Run will be able to register their interest in attending the Dusk Log Book Run in July.

The log book run is free and available to learners with a minimum of 25 hours of logged driving and will be held 9am to 2pm, departing from Narellan Library.

Based on a route from the Drives for Learners in Macarthur booklet, the Log Book Run is a joint program by Camden and Campbelltown City Council, and will include morning tea and lunch.
