Celebrate the reopening of Curry Reserve Water Play Space

Camden's fun-filled Curry Reserve Water Play Space is back and better than ever!

Council completed a number of improvements while the space was closed over winter, to ensure it was comfortable for, and accessible to, all residents. Residents will now be able to enjoy:

- The new wheelchair-accessible change facility, including an adult hoist and new toilet, shower and change room amenities;
- Wet wheelchairs, which residents can use to play in the water elements of the space;
- Additional shade structures;
- Additional seating;
- · Additional barbeque facilities; and
- Additional pathways.

Mayor of Camden, Cr Theresa Fedeli, said Council was hosting a community fun day on **Saturday 7 September**, **10am-1pm**, **at Curry Reserve**, **Camden Valley Way**, **Elderslie** to celebrate the space's reopening.

"There will be a free sausage sizzle as well as jumping castles and glitter tattoos for the kids at the event," Cr Fedeli said.

"The accessible amenities building is a fantastic addition to an already well-loved space. When excavation work began for this new building just last year, workers uncovered buried artefacts, including some intact old bottles and crockery. We had to cease work for a few weeks while an archaeologist examined the site and artefacts, which delayed the building's delivery.

"I'm so proud it's now up and running and our community will be able to enjoy the space to its fullest. I'm excited to see residents make new memories here as the weather starts to warm up."

Parking for the event will be available at Curry Reserve, Harrington Green, corner Camden Valley Way and Hilder Street Elderslie.
