Help improve your next experience at Curry Reserve Water Play Space

Residents are invited to provide feedback on Curry Reserve Water Play Space, to help improve user experience in time for its reopening later this year.

Mayor of Camden, Cr Peter Sidgreaves, said thousands of people visited Camden's first water play park since its grand opening in December 2018.

"This space truly was a fantastic addition to the Camden area, opening just in time to allow residents of all ages and abilities to cool off, have fun and enjoy the beautiful summer months," Cr Sidgreaves said.

"There was something for everyone to enjoy, with three splash pads and 36 accessible play features all with heated water.

"Being the first facility of its kind, Council is eager to hear what our community thought about it – what they enjoyed most, what they liked least and what they'd like to see improved.

"The \$2.4 million water play park will close on Sunday 28 April and will reopen for a new season of play on Sunday 1 September. We will use this break in opening to review the facility and identify opportunities to ensure residents' experiences are even better next time around."

The survey is open until Monday 29 April 2019.

Construction of the new wheelchair-accessible change facilities, including an adult hoist and new toilet, shower and change room amenities are due to be complete in August 2019. Their delivery was delayed due to the unexpected find of historical artefacts at the site but will be ready to use next spring.
