Local businesses learnt how to take off this morning, at an exclusive event with Western City and Aerotropolis Authority CEO, Sam Sangster.

Camden Council, in partnership with Camden Region Economic Taskforce (CRET), hosted the business breakfast this morning (Thursday 14 November) at Council's Administration Building. It provided attendees information about the opportunities available to them, to grow and expand their business, as part of the Western Sydney Airport.

The guest of honour, Mr Sangster, said the 22nd century city being built around the Western Sydney Airport will have a big impact on surrounding areas, including Camden.

"We are attracting new industries to the Western Parkland City to create 200,000 knowledge jobs over the next 20 years," Mr Sangster said.

"Some of the biggest advanced manufacturing firms in the world have already committed to the Aerotropolis, including Hitachi, DB Schenker and Mitsubishi Heavy Industries.

"This investment will bring the best jobs closer to home for people who live in Camden, so they no longer have to look to the east."

Mayor of Camden, Cr Theresa Fedeli, said the event was a sell-out.

"It was terrific to have Mr Sangster with us this morning," Cr Fedeli said.

"Sam's career spans both the public and private sectors, including significant roles with some of Australia's largest ASX-listed companies and professional service firms.

"The Western Sydney Airport is right at Camden's doorstep, perfectly positioned for our area to benefit from the many business prospects and population growth to come.

"I know today's attendees had lots of information and ideas to soak up and I am sure we'll see many of them take advantage of some exciting opportunities in the near future."
