- More than 50 stalls and displays.

Everyone's favourite TV vet, Dr Harry Cooper OAM, will be the special guest, holding a meet and greet with four-legged residents and their owners and judging competitions (which start from 10am under the big marquee in the arena). Residents can enter their pet in five different award categories, including:

- Best trick;

- Best NRL supporter.
