Camden welcomes 110 new citizens on Australian Citizenship Day

Camden Council celebrated Australian Citizenship Day yesterday (Tuesday 17 September) by welcoming 110 new citizens to the community.

Yesterday's citizenship ceremony was the fourth of five ceremonies Council will hold this year.

Mayor of Camden, Cr Theresa Fedeli, said Camden's newest citizens came from more than 20 different countries, including Lebanon, Colombia, India and Malaysia.

"Coming from an Italian background myself, I know just how special it is to be officially welcomed into a new community," Cr Fedeli said.

"Which is why it is my pleasure to welcome people from all different countries into this community. It's one of my favourite things about being Mayor.

"I'm so proud our community is so diverse, woven together by respect. The residents who make up the Camden community identify with more than 100 different nationalities, were born in more than 80 different countries, speak more than 60 different languages and adhere to more than 35 different religions.

"This is something I very strongly feel should be embraced and celebrated. Seeing these new, valued members so eager to commit to our community fills me with pride.

"We are so blessed to live in Australia and it's a special thing to see our residents come forward and pledge themselves to this country – to knowingly embrace Australian values, to contribute to our country's future and to really BE an Australian."

Yesterday, Australia welcomed the largest number of new citizens nationally since the inaugural Australian Citizenship Day in 2001. There were 150 ceremonies hosted across the country, with more than 8,000 people becoming Australian citizens.
