Curry Reserve Water Play Space set to get even better

Camden's much-loved Curry Reserve Water Play Space is about to get even better, with improvement works given the green light at last night's Ordinary Meeting.

Council will invest an extra \$350,000 to construct additional:

- Shade structures;
- Seating;
- Barbeque facilities; and
- Pathways.

Mayor of Camden, Cr Theresa Fedeli, said the improvements would be complete and ready to use when the water play park reopened, on Sunday 1 September.

"Earlier this year we asked the community to provide feedback on Curry Reserve Water Play Space," Cr Fedeli said.

"Being the first facility of its kind, we were eager to hear what residents thought about it. The submissions we received allowed us to schedule these improvements to ensure residents' experiences are even better next time around.

"I'm excited to see our community make new memories here as the weather starts to warm up."

Construction of the new wheelchair-accessible change facilities, including an adult hoist and new toilet, shower and change room amenities are also due to be complete in time for the water play park's reopening. Their delivery was delayed due to the unexpected find of historical artefacts at the site.
