



#### Unsafe foods for your dog and cat



#### Dogs:

- Onions and garlic Can damage a dogs red blood cells
- Chocolate Contains caffeine and theobromine which affect the heart and nervous system of dogs
- Some bones Small and brittle bones like fish and chicken legs as well as cooked bones
- Grapes and raisins Contain a toxin that can cause damage to dogs kidneys
- Raw eggs Raw egg whites contain avidin a protein that depletes bioton.
   Excessive consumption leads to skin and hair problems
- Caffeine Caffeine is a stimulant that can cause heart palpitations
- Fatty and oily food Too much fatty food can cause pancreatitis

#### Cats:

- Onions and garlic Eating some types of onion on a regular basis could cause anaemia
- Chocolate Can cause heart arrhythmias, muscle tremors, or seizures
- Fat trimmings Raw meat, raw eggs and raw fish can cause vomiting and diarrhoea

#### How to be a Responsible Pet Owner

Your pet relies on you for shelter, warmth, food, exercise and most importantly love. Here are some facts that will help you to be the best animal parent you can be!

#### Microchip

- Having your dogs and cats microchipped will help them find their way home
- Make sure you update your dog or cats details with Council when you move
- Make sure your dog and cat are wearing a collar with a name tag

#### **Shelter**

- Make sure your dog and cat have shade when it is hot or cold
- The best place for your cat at night is inside

#### Food and water

- Your dog and cat needs

   a balanced diet to keep them
   healthy just like you
- Make sure they have plenty of water especially when its hot

#### Register

- Registering your dogs and cats an important part of being a responsible pet owner
- Lifetime register your dogs and cats at Council
- If your dog or cat is desexed your registration fee is less

#### **Exercise**

- Make sure your dog gets plenty of exercise
- Like you your dog also needs to go for walks to keep healthy – An "Active dog is a Happy dog"
- Look at taking your dog to Council's off leash areas
- Cats also need to play so look at buying some toys to keep them active and happy

#### **Desex**

- Having your dogs and cats desexed will help control unwanted puppies and kittens
- Ask your local vet for information

#### Secure yard

- Make sure your dog can not get out of it's yard by checking all the fences are secure
- Make sure to close and lock all your gates when you leave your yard








#### How to Greet a Dog (and What to Avoid)

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#### **How Kids SHOULD Interact with Dogs**

Use common sense.

Be polite and kind to pets





Learn to recognize when your dog is scared or anxious

Play appropriate games with pets, such as:

Fetch





Training tricks (like roll over, shake, beg, etc.)

Walking and running with a dog





Playing hide-n-seek

#### Always remember:

Supervise all interactions. Accidents can happen in a split second.





Train your dog to associate the kids with positive experiences so he'll be more likely to tolerate your child in case she accidentally interacts inappropriately.

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#### Some cool facts about cats

- Cats are carnivores this means they eat meat
- Most cats weigh between 2.5 7 kilograms
- Cats conserve their energy by sleeping an average 13 14 hours a day
- Cats spend a large amount of time licking their coats to keep them clean
- Cats have 30 teeth
- A cats nose is like a humans fingerprint
- Cats have a strong sense of smell (about 14 times stronger than a human)
- On average, an indoor cat lives twelve years or more
- On average an outdoor cat's life expectancy is less than five years





#### Some cool facts about dogs

- Adult dogs have 42 teeth
- The dog's average life expectancy is 8 to 15 years
- At birth puppies are deaf, blind, and toothless and have almost no sense of smell
- Dogs have twice as many muscles for moving their ears as people
- Some dogs grow 30 millimetres of fur per day
- Dogs only sweat from the bottoms of their feet, the only way they can discharge heat is by panting
- Dalmatians are born spotless: at first pure white, their spots develop as they age
- Contrary to popular belief, dogs aren't colour blind; they can see shades of blue, yellow, green and grey.
   The colour red registers on a greyscale in a dog's vision
